

The Message Stick **holds an invitation** for parishioners across the Archdiocese to come together on Pentecost Sunday, 2024, at the Cathedral to celebrate this momentous occasion. On Welcoming this message stick, we will pray together a special prayer composed for the occasion of the 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the "mother church" of our Archdiocese.

After consultation, the Archbishop is pleased to announce that the Franciscan Friars will take on the pastoral care of Our Lady, Queen of Apostles parish, Stafford from 15th January next year. Fr Joe Mackay OFM has been appointed Administrator of the parish but will remain in residence in the Franciscan community at Kedron.

The parishes of Little Flower, Kedron and Queen of Apostles, Stafford will remain as separate parishes at this time. However, I expect there will be opportunities for fruitful collaboration and cooperation between the communities that will serve the mission of God in the local area.

I am sure you will join me in welcoming this news.

May the peace of the Risen Christ be with you and may Mary, Queen of Apostles, guard and protect you on your way.

#### THE LITURGIES OF NOVEMBER

November is traditionally associated in the Catholic Church with remembrance of the dead. True remembrance is not just about looking back to the past but also looking ahead to the future in trust and hope. Just as our loved ones shared in Christ's death in baptism, we believe that they will share in Christ's resurrection and enjoy eternal life in God's presence.

The feast of All Saints recognises all the saints of heaven, both known and unknown, in a single celebration. The feast of All Saints first appeared in the fourth century

when Eastern Church introduced a feast to celebrate martyrs on the Sunday after Pentecost. By the seventh century, the feast was being observed in the West and included those saints who were not martyrs. The present date of 1<sup>st</sup> November follows a tradition established in England and Ireland.

November 2<sup>nd</sup>, the day after All Saints, is All Souls Day when we remember those who have not yet achieved the goal of the Kingdom of Heaven. The Church has always encouraged prayers for the faithful departed. Every celebration of Mass includes prayers for the dead. On All Souls we pray in unity for our deceased relatives and friends and for those who have no one to pray for them.


3 Amazing Miracle Stories of the Rosary BY LAUDATE MARIAM Secret of the Rosary St. Louis de Montfort Our last story is told by St. Louis De

Montfort in the book "The Secret of the Rosary." Alphonsus, King of Leon and Galicia, constantly wore a large rosary on his belt in order to inspire others to pray it and honor the Blessed Mother. However, he himself

did not pray it.

A King Saved from Hell (Story 3)

One day, the king became extremely ill. Many thought that he would not live much longer. In the midst of this severe illness, the king had a vision. In that vision, he saw himself being judged by the Almighty God. His final judgement? He was to be cast to hell for eternity. All of a sudden, in that vision, the Blessed Mother interceded for



The Blessed Mother called for a pair of scales, where his sins were placed on one side of the

scale. The sins were extremely heavy, and weighed down the sales. On the other side of the scale, Our Lady placed the Rosary that he had always worn, together with all the Rosaries that were said because of his example.

The Rosaries weighed far more than his sins. Our Lady then said: "As a reward for this little honor that you paid me in wearing my Rosary, I have obtained a great grace for you from my Son. Your life will be spared for a few more years. See that you spend these years wisely, and do penance.'

When the King regained consciousness from his vision, he blurted out: "Blessed be the Rosary of the Most Holy Virgin Mary, by which I have been delivered from eternal damnation!"

The king recovered his health, and then spread the rest of his life praying the rosary every day and spreading its devo-
