#### **CHRIST THE KING**

On the last Sunday of the liturgical year (26<sup>th</sup> November this year) the Church celebrates the solemnity of Christ the King, or "Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe", as it is now called in the Roman calendar. The feast was instituted by Pius IX in 1925 as a way of countering the increasing atheism and secularisation of society. It was an assertion of Christ's sovereignty over all human societies and institutions.

Some people might have problems with the language and imagery used in the texts for this celebration, believing that words like 'king' and 'kingdom' carry patriarchal and authoritarian connotations that are incompatible with Christianity and would prefer an image that speaks less of power and authority.

The kingship of Christ is not about the power or splendour often associated with royalty. The Preface for the Feast describes Christ's Kingdom as "a kingdom of truth and life, a kingdom of holiness and grace, a kingdom of justice, love and peace".

With so much conflict across the world at present, the Prayer over the Offerings is very appropriate: "As we offer you, O Lord, the sacrifice by which the human race is reconciled to you, we humbly pray that your Son himself may bestow on all nations the gifts of unity and peace". In the Prayer after Communion we look forward to eternal life with Christ our King: "Having received the food of immortality, we ask, O Lord, that we may live with him eternally in his heavenly Kingdom".

#### **Eastern Rite Catholic Churches**

Pope John Paul II often said that the Catholic Church breathes with two lungs – the Eastern lung and the Western lung. Almost all Australia's Catholics belong to the Latin Rite or the Western Catholic Church, but around 1.1% of Catholics belong to Eastern Catholic Churches. Most Eastern Rite Churches include both Orthodox groups that are not in communion with Rome (e.g. Greek Orthodox, Antiochian Orthodox and Serbian Orthodox) and Catholic groups that are.

There are 93 Eastern Catholic parishes in Australia. The five largest Churches are the Maronite, Melkite, Ukrainian, Chaldean and Syro-Malabar, each of which has a diocese (or eparchy) with a bishop (or eparch) who is a member of the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference. The term 'Eastern' refers to the churches that grew out of the ancient church of Constantinople, capital of the eastern Roman Empire, and those that were formed in Egypt, Syria, Iraq, Ethiopia and India (Syro-Malabar). Eastern Catholic Churches in Brisbane include the Ukrainian Byzantine Church at Woolloongabba, St Clément's Melkite Church in South Brisbane (near State High) and St Maroun's Maronite Church at Greenslopes. Because the Eastern Catholic Churches are in communion with Rome, their clergy may concelebrate with Latin rite priests and Catholics may receive communion at a celebration of the Eucharist in an Eastern Catholic Church. But there are differences. Unlike the west, the Eastern Church has maintained the unity of the sacraments of initiation, so baptism, confirmation (or 'chrismation') and first communion are celebrated together for both adults and infants. Some children initiated in Eastern Catholic Churches have been 'reconfirmed' in the Roman Catholic Church as the result of ignorance about who belongs to the Catholic Church family. The Eastern Churches permit married men to dained. (However, an unmarried priest is not allowed to marry after ordination.) Other differences include the prominence given to chant, incense, candles and processions in liturgy, stricter rules for fasting and abstinence, the following of a different (Julian) calendar by some Eastern Churches, and the role of icons in worship and spirituality.

#### Our ADVENT preparation for CHRISTMAS

Celebrating the Forgiveness of our Sins:

Why not celebrate our common Sinfulness and that God never ceases to forgive and show us mercy?

On Thursday 14<sup>th</sup> (NOT 12<sup>th</sup>) December, 6.30pm, we will celebrate the Second Rite of Penance. How to do that?? All those who wish to celebrate are asked to consider their sins, (spend some time reflecting on "why do I do these things") and write them and your answer down on a piece of paper BEFORE coming to church that night (DO NOT include your name!!). The basic structure of the Second Rite is: Introduction, Liturgy of the Word, Liturgy of Penance and concluding rite. During the Liturgy of Penance, you will process forward, hand your OPEN sheet of paper to Father, receive Absolution and return to your place.
