Fr Joe's Reflection

Jesus is tempted in the desert (Mark 1:2-15)

Australia is the dry continent. Nearly 18% of Australia is desert while another 70% is semi-arid land receiving an average of less than 5 centimetres of precipitation a year. With little water living things struggle to survive. The Judean desert, east of Jerusalem, is not very large. It runs for 100 kilometres parallel to the Jordan River valley and Dead sea. It is a high rocky plateau cut with steep valleys and is inhabited by vipers, leopards and the hyrax, a large rodent like animal.

Mark's version of the Jesus entering the desert is short. We don't find mention of the three temptations found in Luke or Matthew. The emphasis is on the time and who Jesus encounters there.

Jesus is in the desert for 40 days. This brings to mind the 40 days of the destructive and cleansing rain at the time of Noah (Genesis 7:17); the 40 years of wandering by Moses and the people in the desert before entering the Promised Land (Joshua 5:6); the 40 days Elijah walked to Mt Horeb before encountering God, not in the fire, earthquake or wind but in the silence (1 Kings 19:1-18). Each of these occasions is a moment where the people's relationship with God is challenged and deepened.

Jesus meets Satan and the angels in the desert. Alone in the wilderness we see more starkly the choice between good and evil: The way of Satan or the way of God. The desert environment forces us to focus on the basics just to survive. Alone, we are starkly confronted by your own thoughts and fears. You have only yourself, your demons and God to turn to.

Deserts are challenging but not life-less. Our Aboriginal brothers and sisters in central Australia knew how to cross them because they knew where the food and the water was. Is our life nourished by the sacraments? Do we appreciate the gift of the sacraments, especially baptism, the water of life?

In a busy world we need to find time to enter the desert. A time for silence and contemplation. To stop and listen to what we are really saying to ourselves about who we are: to listen and hear who God invites us to be. We need to take time to confront our demons and draw water from the well of salvation. During the 40 days of Lent may we find time to return to the desert.

Jesus comes out of the desert like a new Elijah. Elijah emerged from the desert, a changed man, having confronted his fear, he is sent by God to anoint mortal kings to do God's will. (1 Kings 19:1-18) Jesus leaves the desert to proclaim that the start of God's reign is near, the Good News. He invites us to do God's will and enter God's kingdom. *Fr Joe McKay ofm*


Church First Aid Information
