Fr Joe's Reflection WHO DO WE LIVE FOR?

This Sunday's Gospel describes the moment that Jesus knows that his Passion is about to start, "the hour has come". He knows he is to die soon.

At this time, Jesus teaches his disciples not about death but life. If we live a life only for ourselves all that we do will die with us. If we live a life for others then it will generate an abundance of

Australia has a proud history of volunteering however the number of volunteers is rapidly falling. In 2002 nearly one third of Australians volunteered their time in support of the community, today that figure is closer to a quarter. Nearly a million people have stopped volunteering their time.

Reasons for not volunteering are commonly around family and work commitments. Today we have a very uncertain work environment and the feeling of always being connected to work via the computer and mobile phone. Many people are increasingly afraid to take long holidays because of the fear it will impact their jobs. People are feeling increasingly tired and just want to relax with their family.

This uncertainty is also affecting the nature of volunteering with more people likely to commit to an occasional event rather than a regular weekly or monthly commitment.

The other trend that is also occurring, particularly in the English speaking-world, is the growing individualism and consumerism.

These trends are affecting everything from finding coaches of sporting teams, to leaders of scout troops to Church. Yes at its heart, the Church is ultimately a community of volunteers! We come to celebrate, pray and care for each other and our broader community. To be the Body of Christ.

Community requires the sacrifice of people's time, effort and resources. When we build community everyone benefits. This is a challenge in today's world. It is counter cultural and a challenge to a world where everything is viewed as a commercial transaction. Volunteering ultimately is a free gift of one's self with no expectation of immediate personal gain. Yet the Gospel

states that when we give of ourselves we will reap a harvest.

Jesus gave himself on the Cross and redeemed the world. What are we prepared to give ? Fr Joe McKay ofm

Second Rite of Reconciliation Wednesday 20th March 7pm

"after having attained the age of discretion, each of the faithful is bound by an obligation faithfully to confess serious sins at least once a year." (CCC 1457)

The rite of reconciliation is one of the healing sacraments of the Church. While we have the celebration of the first rite each week, individual confession in the confessional, the second rite is a communal celebration.

The second rite of reconciliation involves listening to God's word and together undertaking an examination of conscience. In the first rite a priest does not even need to know the identity of penitent who may choose to sit behind a screen. In the second rite confession is celebrated publically. Penitents, in full view of others, privately confess one or two their sins, receive individually a penance and then hear God's mercy in the prayer of absolution. The congregation then together completes the celebration of God's mercy with thanksgiving and a blessing.

The rite reflects the ancient form of the sacrament, when a penitent who had committed a mortal sin and had been expelled from the community, was publically embraced by the bishop and welcomed back into the life of the Church. Even today a priest does not automatically have a right to hear confession, they act on behalf of the bishop to welcome all into God's mercy.

Yes confession is confronting! We are invited to confront our sins and bring them into the Light.

In preparation ask – How could I have loved God and loved my neighbour better?

On Wednesday we will have Fr Joseph & Fr John from Kedron Parish and myself as confessors.



The annual collection for the support of the church in the Holy Land will take place on Good Friday, March 29th. This collection promotes the missionary work of the Church in the Holy providing welfare assistance to local Christians in areas such as health, education, employment, housing.

Parishes, and orphanages. It is also used to maintain over 70 churches and shrines associated with the life of Jesus. Due to the ongoing war, the Church and people of the Holy Land are still struggling

with reduced income due to fewer pilgrims and lower church attendance around the world. In 2023 Australian Catholics were once again extremely generous and we were able to send to the Holy Land nearly \$1.4 million [\$1.4 million (2022), \$1,126,098 (2021), \$406,023 (2020) and \$1.3 million (2019)]. The reality for the Holy Land mission is that they will continue to face challenges financial and spiritual and so we again ask Catholics around the world again to be as generous as possible, with their financial support as well as the spiritual support. Please remember the Christians of the Holy Land



on Good Friday. Thank you.

TIPS ON HOW TO HAVE AN ENVIRON-MENTALLY SUSTATINABLE EASTER

DYED EGGS



Items required: boiled eggs, food colouring, bread bags or saved bags from food, cooling rack or plate.

- 1. Boil your eggs and let them cool
- 2. Take an egg, tap cracks in two sides of the egg (or go crazy and experiment with more!)
- 3. Pop the egg in a bag and put in a small amount of food dye (we recommend saving bread bags or food bags for this step)
- 4. Manipulate the bag so that the dye covers the whole egg, then gently put the egg out onto the drying rack.
- 5. Repeat for remaining eggs and colours
- 6. Leave to dry then gently peel off the shell to reveal your masterpiece! Care for Creation


