Fr Joe's Reflection Palm Sunday

When Jesus first enters the city of Jerusalem he is hailed as a King by the crowd. The Jewish people were expecting a Messiah, someone who would overthrow the Romans' occupation. Many were armed and ready for an uprising. Other people felt threatened by Jesus' teaching, the Jewish civil and community leadership, because he challenged their privilege and hypocrisy. Ultimately, for those who met him in Jerusalem, he was not the Messiah they expected.

In the Western World, the Christian Church no longer has the support of the surrounding culture, institutions and political structures. Our schools, hospitals and charities are praised and tolerated because of their social usefulness but are just as often co-opted and controlled through state funding. In many countries there is no freedom of religion.

Following Jesus, Christians are often called to stand counter to the prevailing worldview to maintain their faith. Throughout history the Church community has had to face challenges and persecution from the surrounding culture and called again to enter into Christ's passion.

Often these times of trials become times of renewal and rebirth for the Church. When our faith is challenged we are often called to look at ourselves in the light of the Gospel. We are challenged to let go of all that is unimportant and hold onto Christ. Our image of God and Church is tested and our mission as Christians is strengthened, clarified and renewed. TIPS ON HOW TO HAVE AN ENVIRON-MENTALLY SUSTATINABLE EASTER

Laudato Si, Chapter 4(161)

The pace of consumption, waste and environmental change has so stretched the planet's capacity that our contemporary lifestyle, unsustainable as it is, can only precipitate catastrophes, such as those which even now periodically occur in different areas of the world. The effects of the present imbalance can only be reduced by our decisive action, here and now. We need to reflect on our accountability before who will have to endure the dire consequences.

RECYCLING ALUMINIUM FOIL The **Australian Aluminium Council** reports that aluminium (unlike plastic) can be recycled endlessly without compromising any of its unique properties or quality. However, in order to be captured during the recycling process, the aluminium piece needs to be quite large – small pieces of Easter egg wrappings would be lost in this process, but you can fix this by: Keeping an aluminium can and putting all small foil pieces into the can until it's full before popping it in the recycling bin *Saving all your Easter egg wrappers and making them into one large Easter egg ball (at least a tennis ball size is preferred) *Keeping an aluminium can and putting all small foil pieces into the can until it's full before popping it in the recycling bin


Annual Leave for the Parish Secretary

Easter Triduum For Your Kids"

Make sure they know the story.

Make sure they know that God became Man and died for them, to open the gates of Heaven so they could join him there someday, because he loves them more than they can imagine. That's all you really need to do.

One way to do this is to read picture books for the little ones about the first Easter. For older kids, read the Mass readings together at home, so the kids have some time to think and pray about them in a calm and private setting.

Holy Thursday

Holy Thursday is the day when Christ instituted the Holy Eucharist at the Last Supper, so this is a day when you talk about what Holy Communion means. Those who have already received mention why they are thankful, kids not yet old enough to receive share what they are looking forward to.

Another meaningful activity is washing each other's feet, like Jesus did at the Last Supper with his disciples.

If you live in an area with a lot of local churches, today is the traditional Seven Churches Visitation. That's a fun and memorable way to honour the day.





Good Friday

Pray the Stations of the Cross on Good Friday. Venerate a crucifix: Each member of the household kisses the crucifix while praying "We adore Thee, O Christ, and we bless Thee because by Thy Holy Cross Thou hast redeemed the world."

Holy Saturday

Holy Saturday feels like a long day of holding your breath, between the inhale of Good Friday and the exhale of Easter. Fortunately, there's lots to do!

Cleaning the house and cooking to prepare for the Easter feast are fun things to do. This is the day Easter eggs are traditionally dyed. Talk about the symbolism of eggs as a sign of new life and rebirth. Enjoy some of the hot cross



Buns or the chocolate crown of thorns made the day before! Read some of those Easter picture books and joyfully say "Alleluia! He is risen!"


These are supplementary activities as the BEST way is really to attend the Easter liturgies in church and the kids will have their first hand experience in knowing the story by heart.:)
