

Fr Joe's Reflection - Fourth Sunday of Easter Year B Good Shepherd Sunday - "Listen to my Voice"

In Australia we have the image of the drover. Those amazing horseman who guided sheep and cattle along the nation's stock routes, over thousands of kilometres. Today there are still old Aboriginal stockman who travelled all over Australia on the back of a horse. The heydays of the 'long paddock' may have ended in the sixties, replaced with road transport, but droughts and floods in recent years have driven farmers to call on drovers again to guide sheep and cattle, on the road, in search of food and water: in search of life. The ancient role of a shepherd continues even here in Australia.

The Bible often refers to the leaders of the people as shepherds, both good and bad. The bad shepherds were weak and corrupt leaders who took advantage of the people. Jesus in the Gospel also talks about the 'hired hands', those that have no love or care for the people, who ran away when the people were threatened by difficulties. They were not willing to risk anything to feed and protect the flock. Pope Francis has regularly reminded priests that they should have the "smell of the sheep", to be close carers rather than be aloof career managers of the church.

Jesus doesn't just care about his disciples but everyone, "the sheep not of this fold". He has a desire that all people will have the security of knowing that they are loved and cared for by God. Jesus lays down his life for everyone.

The death and resurrection of Jesus are seen by the Gospel as an expression of God's love and power. Jesus does not finish his minis-

try on the Cross, or at the Ascension. He leads his people having shared in the difficulties of this world. The Crucified and Risen Christ continues to lead his people towards salvation today. Jesus leads people through the actions of the Church: the sacraments, the proclaiming and the living of the Word of God.

Paradoxically Christians are called to be both sheep, followers of Christ, and shepherds, people who call, protect and guide others on the way of salvation in Jesus' name.

Just like the need for drovers in times of droughts and floods, there is still a need in the Church for God's shepherds. People who guide others on the way towards Jesus, towards salvation.

This weekend we celebrate Vocation Sunday. We celebrate that we have been individually called by Christ.

And the Church renews its call, in Jesus' name, for people to deepen their commitment to serve and guide others. Fr Joe McKay OFM



Seven little known fact; about Anzac Day



3. Aboriginal Australians were not allowed to enlist in WW1 Despite not being legally allowed to serve, many Aboriginal Australians lied about their race to enlist. Sadly, their involvement is still rarely recognised even though it is believed that almost one thousand of them (out of an estimated indigenous population of 80,000) served during WW1.

6. The word "Anzac" is protected The word "Anzac" is protected under Australian law and misuse can incur a penalty of up to 12 months in prison or a large fine. The Protection of Word 'Anzac' Regulations 1921 (Cth) (the Regulations) broadly state that to use the word 'Anzac' (or any word resembling the word 'Anzac') in an official or corporate manner, permission from the Minister for Veterans' Affairs is required.

7. Origin of Anzac acronym The acronym ANZAC was devised by Major General William Birdwood's staff in Cairo in 1915.

It is important that our students continue to honour the Anzac Day tradition. I'm hoping that the example you have set in bringing them to parades and services will continue in the future when they have their own children and bring them to Anzac ceremonies.
