Love God and love your neighbour as yourself. How clearly Jesus distils the law. Yet, every so often our behaviour might suggest that love of God and neighbour don't actually have to go together. While most of us haven't gone that far afield from Jesus's teaching, we could all certainly do much better in connecting the love and reverence we show God in our liturgy with the love and reverence we show one another within and outside the liturgy. Perhaps we can follow more fervently these updated commandments:

• You shall recognise God's presence at the altar and in the unfamiliar person seated behind you, and greet both with reverence.

• You shall hear God's voice in the proclamation of the readings and in the cry of the infant, and you shall be attentive to both, receiving them joyfully.

• You shall love God with all your heart in the Eucharist you share, and you shall love those who eat and drink with you, for they are your fellow members in the Body of Christ.

You shall take the love of God you have received into the world, starting with the stranger who stands alone after Mass.

If we do follow these, we shall not be far from the kingdom of God. **P**arish Pastoral Council (PPC): The PPC represents the larger parish and it is important that you make your ideas, needs and hopes (both spiritual and temporal) known. Much of what we achieved this year was in response to parishioners' feedback received via PPC members or through the 2016 National Church Life Survey. For example, the idea to expand after Mass Fellowship to all Masses on the

3rd weekend of the month came from a parishioner.
