to guess what will be added to the stable over the next week (and what has been added from last week??) AD-VENT is a time of waiting and expectation—this will help your kids.

Pope Francis said that safeguarding children was the Church's top priority, and was more important than preserving its reputation or avoiding scan-



dal. "Families should also know that they have every right to turn to the Church with full confidence, for it is a safe and secure home. Consequently, priority must not be given to any other kind of concern, whatever its na-

ture, such as the desire to avoid scandal, since there is absolutely no place in ministry for those who abuse mi-

nors." He said, "Pastors and those in charge of religious communities should be available to meet with victims and their loved ones; such meetings are valuable opportunities



for listening to those have greatly suffered and for asking their forgiveness," he added. He revealed that "This experience reaffirmed my conviction that everything possible must be done to rid the Church of the scourge of the sexual abuse of minors and to open pathways of reconciliation and healing for those who were abused,"
