**A ustralia Day**—has only been celebrated Australia-wide since **1994.** It really does not have a long Australian history, ... But for many Indigenous people, the date represents the beginning of a forced separa-

tion from their traditional culture.

... Indigenous peoples are believed to have inhabited Australia some 50 000 years ago. In the last 200 years, Europe-

ans decimated them through colonisation, sickness and documented massacres. The Australian Government did not even recognise Aborigines as people, only providing them with full voting rights after 1962. ... As we celebrate a date then that recognises European

settlement on (the East Coast of) Australia, we must address the consequences of that settlement. The common good, the dignity of the human person made in the image of God is core to our identity as Catholics. "Catholic" literally means "universal". When one of us suffers, so do we all. It would be dualistic to pick and choose who we apply these planks of social justice to. If we are being authentically catholic, walking in the footsteps of Jesus..., then they apply to all. 



This will be achieved through the development of respectful relationships and a commitment to safety embracing appropriate boundaries, behaviours and practices, in accordance with the Archdiocese of Brisbane Code of Ethical Behaviour for employees and volunteers who work in service of the Church as well as adherence to the legislative imperatives of the State.
