he Social Justice Group in our Parish researches various Justice issues that concern us all in the proclamation of the "Good News". If you'd like to join them, email/phone the office and we'll put you in touch. Here's their latest news:

In 1787 when preparing for the expedition of the First Fleet, Captain Arthur Phillip famously wrote: 'In a new country there will be no slavery and hence no slaves'. 231 years later, the Modern Slavery Bill 2018, having passed all stages of the Australian Parliament on 29 November 2018, came into effect on 1 January 2019. It is the world's second anti-slavery law, after legislation was passed in Britain in 2015. Companies and public bodies with a turnover of \$100 million or more are now required to publish annual statements outlining the risk of slavery in their operations and supply chains, and actions taken to address this. These reports will

taken to address this. These reports will be published on a public register. Two controversial omissions are penalties and independent oversight. Our parish has made its small contribution to ongoing awareness of this important issue. For more information: Modern Slavery Bill 2018




