roject Compassion Envelopes are processed here at the parish. Please follow these suggestions to make it easier for you and me.

Tips on how to use them best.

- * Give generously!
- * Fill in the tear off portion if wanting a receipt for tax purposes.
- * Place tear off portion inside envelope. Do not leave it attached to the outside of the envelope. It rips when opening the envelope to process your donation.
- * To save you time, after filling in your details on your first envelope—just print your name clearly on subsequent envelopes when at Stafford.
- * All credit card payments are processed at the end of the campaign. If you would like to make a donation now, there are instructions for phone and internet on the back of the larger envelope.
- * Don't encourage children or others to put empty envelopes on the plate. I still need to sort them, checking for money or credit card payments.
- * If you miss a week, put your donations into one envelope only it saves time for you and me.
- * Finalise all donations by 28th April.

The PARISH OF TODAY AND THE FUTURE: "U.S. theologian Elizabeth Johnson, issues a timely warning: A person can no longer be a Christian simply out of social convention or inherited custom. Faith now requires a personal decision, the kind of decision that brings about a change of heart and sustains long-term commitment. (Abounding in Kindness, Elizabeth Johnson, Orbis books 2nd printing 2018. p.33). This assertion aligns comfortably with the growing awareness that deepened discipleship of Jesus is the core factor in renewing and reforming parishes. A 'more of the same' decree-type of leadership does not bring about this kind of transformation.

E NEED YOUR HELP! (especially for our biggest mass—the 9am) The shop is a valuable service for many and we really need at LEAST one more person per Mass to be on its roster. .00AM MASS people: Because of the pressures on the shop roster (above) we need at least two people to volunteer to organise the collectors during mass and for those who bring up the bread and wine. Both these jobs are very simple and Fr Denis will explain what to do. The BLOOD OF CHRIST! AMEN! While many Eucharistic or Communion services usually seem rote and ceremonial, being fully present to its symbolism can and should startle us. While the experience of eating Jesus' body and blood can be comfort-

ing, it should also be deeply discomforting. Many mystics and liberation theologians have recognized that by inviting us to drink wine *as his blood*, Jesus is calling us to live in bodily solidarity



"with the blood of every person whose blood has been unjustly shed on this earth, from the blood of Abel the Holy to the blood of Zechariah" (Matthew 23:35). These are the first and last murders noted in the Hebrew Bible. In the act of drinking the blood of Christ at this Holy Meal, we are consciously uniting with all unjust suffering in the world, from the beginning of time till its



(from page one) end. Wherever there was and is suffering, there is the empathy and healing justice of God—and we are joining with God insofar as we can. "This is all my blood!" Jesus is saying and we are agreeing.

I can see why Christians celebrate the Eucharist so often. This message is such a shock to the psyche, such a challenge to our pride and individualism, that it takes a lifetime of practice and much vulnerability for it to sink in—as the pattern of every thing, not just the bread and wine. Every thing is in Christ and Christ is in every thing. There is only one suffering, and it is the suffering of God. There is only one love, and it is all the love of God – Richard Rohr Meditation: Holy Blood.


