The Ascension of the Lord (Year C) 01/02 June, 2019

Resurrection follows the Cross (Easter after Good Friday). Over the Easter Season, we can meditate on the "Stations of the Cross" that Pope Francis prayed on Good Friday. It was composed by Sr Eugenia Bonetti who has given her life to saving victims of human trafficking.

(The "eagle-eyed ones among us noted that I missed the 6th & 7th Stations last week. Here they are!):

Sixth Station Veronica wipes the face of Jesus

"As you did it to one of the least of these my brethren, you did it to me" (Mt 25:40)

Meditation:

Let us think of all those children in various parts of the world who cannot go to school but are instead exploited in mines, fields and fisheries, bought and sold by human traffickers for organ harvesting, used and abused on our streets by many, including Christians, who have lost the sense of their own and others' sacredness. Like the young girl with a slim body we met one evening in Rome while men in luxury cars lined up to exploit her. She might have been the age of their own children. What kind of imbalance can this violence create in the lives of all those young women who experience only the oppression, arrogance and indifference of those who, night and day, seek them out, use them and exploit them, only to cast them back onto the street again, as prey for the next trader in human lives?

Prayer:

Lord Jesus, cleanse our eyes so that we can see your face in our brothers and sisters, especially in all those children who, in many parts of the world, are living in poverty and squalor. Children deprived of their right to a happy childhood, education and innocence. Little ones used as cheap goods, bought and sold at will. Lord, we ask you to have mercy and compassion on this sick world. Help us rediscover the beauty of our dignity, and that of others, as human beings created in your image and likeness.

Let us pray together, saying: "Lord, help us to see":

- the faces of innocent children who ask for our help;
- social injustices;
- people's inherent dignity that is violated.

Seventh Station

Jesus Falls tor the Second Time

"When he suffered, he did not threaten; but he entrusted himself to the one who judges justly" (1 Pet 2:23)

Meditation:

What a thirst for vengeance we see all around us! Our societies today have lost the great value of forgiveness, a gift second to none, a cure for wounds, the basis of peace and human coexistence. In a society where forgiveness is seen as weakness, you, Lord, ask us not to stop at appearances. Not with words, but by your example. To those who tortured

you, you asked: "Why do you persecute me?" For you knew very well that true justice can never be based on hatred and revenge. Make us capable of asking for, and granting for-giveness.

Prayer:

Father, forgive them; for they know not what they do" (*Lk* 23:34). Lord, you too bore the burden of condemnation, rejec-

In the certainty that the Father had not abandoned you, you found the strength to accept his will by offering forgiveness, love and hope to those who today, like you, walk the same path of ridicule, contempt, mockery, abandonment, betrayal and loneliness.

Let us pray together and say: "Lord, help us to give comfort":

- to those who feel offended and insulted;
- to those who feel betrayed and humiliated;
- to those who feel judged and condemned.





"When I can see my image in it," he replied."

ope Francis on World Day for Migrants and Refugees: Titled, "It is not just about migrant": "The signs of meanness we see around us heighten our fear of 'the other', the unknown, the marginalized, the foreigner," he said.

"The problem is not that we have doubts and fears," he said, "The problem is when they condition our way of thinking and acting to the point of making us intolerant, closed and perhaps even - without realizing it - racist."

"In this way, fear deprives us of the desire and the ability to encounter the other, the person different from myself; it deprives me of an opportunity to encounter the Lord."

Pope Francis in his message said migrants and refugees are not a threat, but "an invitation to recover some of those essential dimensions of our Christian existence and our humanity that risk being overlooked in a prosperous society."

"When we show concern for them, we also show concern for ourselves, for everyone; in taking care of them, we all grow; in listening to them, we also give voice to a part of ourselves that we may keep hidden because it is not well regarded nowadays," he said. He pointed out that the progress of a nation "depends above all on our openness to being touched and moved by those who knock at our door. Their faces shatter and debunk all those false idols that can take over and enslave our lives."

In every political activity, in every programme, in every pastoral action we must always put the person at the center, in his or her many aspects, including the spiritual dimension. And this applies to all people, whose fundamental equality must be recognized,"
