

Australia's First Peoples consist of over 250 different Language Groups. Each group is distinct from one another in rituals, sacred knowledge and belief systems.

Some Tips From The Environment Committee:

Let's consider plastic? Plastics are a curse to our environment; they choke our water ways, kill our wildlife and enter the food chain. Approximately 38,000 tonnes of plastic was sent to landfill in Brisbane last year via household rubbish bins, including lots of plastic products that could have been recycled or avoided. Plastic Free July is an international effort to reduce our dependency on plastics, particularly single use plastics. Some simple adjustments to old habits will significantly reduce your plastic consumption. Here are a few ideas.....

- Avoid pre-packaged fruits and vegetables, many green grocers provide loose produce
- Take your own 'keep cup' when you purchase your favourite coffee/tea. Many cafes acknowledge the 'green efforts' of customers who bring their own cup, offering discounts for the purchase
- Consider the plastic packaging that is used for dog and cat food. Prepare your own pet food, and refrigerate in airtight containers.
- Embrace 'nude food' lunch boxes. Pack your lunch in reusable, airtight containers and avoid the soft plastic wrap.
- Place the 'left overs' in reusable airtight containers, rather than covering the dish with soft plastic wrap. Or consider using beeswax wraps, they are hygienic, pliable and come in a range of colours.




