Campaign — This weekend, our Parish Finance Council is presenting a general report about our finances, answering any questions and underlining the im-


portance of ALL income earning parishioners to contribute in a planned way to the upkeep of our parish and to support its activities.

#### JOHN LENNON WALL:

After his murder on 8 December 1980, John Lennon became a pacifist hero for many young Czechs. An image of Lennon was painted on a wall in a secluded square opposite the French embassy along with political graffiti and occasionally Beatles lyrics.

Despite repeated coats of white-wash, the secret police never managed to keep it clean for long, and the Lennon Wall became a



political focus for Prague youth (a lot of Western pop music was banned by the communists, and some Czech musicians were even jailed for playing it). HONG KONG protestors have used this concept by

having 'post-its' put on people's shirts or walls all over Hong Kong despite them being pulled down or pro-Beijing forces.. It's a way powerful forces can't silence protest.

OUR LENNON WALL—THIS WEEKEND, people are invited to put a couple of words calling for justice for Asylum Seekers and Refugees on a Post-It (provided at the back of the church) and place it on our white paper "wall" on the Front Door of the Church.—All ages can participate. Our "wall" will be joined with other parish "walls" at a ceremony on 6th September.


