3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time - Year A 25th/26th January 2020

The Parish Council discussed the issue of reducing the number of Weekend Masses. The issues considered are in previous newsletters including the one of 25th December.

Some Positive Consequences mentioned were:

- A. Our limited roster of Instrumentalists and Vocalists will not have to "double-up" on extra Masses so often

 we have few volunteers joining these.
- B. More people at any one of the remaining masses, hopefully will foster a better spirit and encourage better singing and responding (some thing essential to make Mass more "attractive" to Adults and especially children—and help faith grow.)

If the statement from 'Music in Catholic Worship' is true, we cannot NOT try to improve our celebrations— (para 6: Faith grows when it is well expressed in celebration. Good celebrations foster and nourish faith. Poor celebrations weaken and destroy faith.") This is the responsibility of **EVERYONE**.

WHAT HAPPENS NEXT??

- Weekend Feb 8/9th: Voting Forms available for all WHO ARE AT MASS this weekend. (If you are a regular but CANNOT attend this weekend, please contact Fr Denis).
 - **People vote for** 1) Their **MOST** PREFERRED Mass Time *AND* 2) Their **SECOND MOST** PREFERRED Mass Time.
- **10th-12th Feb: Votes are counted** (1 point for every "Most Preferred" and then 1 point is added for every "Second Most Preferred")
- Weekend 15th/16th Feb: Results are posted in the Newsletter including notice of which Mass time is least preferred and will be discontinued.
 - **Note:** If two or more Mass times are within 10% of the number of points for each other, then **issues such as** the quality of congregational singing and responding, the number of Readers, Special Ministers etc who are available for rostering, participation in post-mass cuppas, the sense of "belonging" etc **will determine the result.**
- Weekend Feb 22nd/23rd: The last weekend for the Mass time which will be discontinued.

National President of the St Vincent de Paul Society Claire Victory said today that the needs of people affected by the bushfire crisis are front of mind for the many volunteers and staff at Vinnies engaged in recovery efforts. Ms Victory said the Society is responding in all affected states and territories through local Vinnies conferences in many communities in affected areas. The Society is responding through its network of local conferences and support services as the crisis develops. We understand there are many, many organisations engaged in the immediate emergency response. The Society is doing what it can, working with these organisations to meet the needs in local communities. 'Once the smoke has literally settled, and the extent of the devastation dawns on individuals, families and whole communities, the Society will be there to help with the recovery process as people begin to rebuild their lives. We are present, at the service of those communities, providing personal and practical support and referral to professional services. Vinnies is part of an integrated, whole-of-community response the government can call upon now, and in the weeks and months ahead. We are working with other lead agencies to accompany people whose lives have been devastated by the fires. 'Right now, cash is needed. People can donate by visiting the Vinnies website or through our shops. 'Cash is the most useful contribution at this point in time. We do not have the capacity to sort and store additional furniture, clothing or other items in the affected areas right now, and we want to be able to support those people needing our help in the best way that meets their individual needs. We will be part of a major, targeted fundraising effort on the January long weekend and will provide further details closer to the date,' Ms Victory said. The St Vincent de Paul Society in Australia consists of 60,000 members and volunteers who operate on the ground through over 1,000 conferences located in individual parishes across the country.

- Cooperating with Catholic Religious Australia and religious institutes and their ministries.
- Parishes across the country taking up a special collection at Masses on the Australia Day weekend (At Stafford it'll be 15/16th Feb), with all funds to be donated to Vinnies' bushfire appeal.

<u>UR</u> Bushfire appeal. 15/16th Feb. If you use the envelopes provided, tax deductible receipts can be issued. Our local Vinnies will transfer the money to the local Narooma/Bermagui/Cobargo Conference (one parish with three towns) to distribute according to needs. We are also considering some "personal" contacts to help bolster morale in these towns e.g. letters from parishioners, kids at our school or even some video messages. We'll keep you informed.


