nfo about Novel Coronavirus (2019-nCoV):
Coronaviruses are a large family of viruses that
cause illnesses ranging from the common cold to
move severe diseases such as (MERS) and (SARS).

Signs and Symptoms:

The virus can cause a range of symptoms, ranging from mild illness to pneumonia. People **may** experience: 1) fever; 2) flu-like symptoms such as coughing, sore throat or headaches; or 3) difficulty breathing in some cases.

Exclusion from Worship or Parish Activities: A) If public health authorities have informed an individual that they have been in close contact with a confirmed case of the novel

coronavirus (2019-nCoV), even if they don't have symptoms must self-isolate for 14 days. B) If an individual has recently travelled to visited Hubei Province of China they need to self-isolate for 14 days after leaving Hubei Province.

How can I help prevent the spread of 2019-nCoV?

1)Cleaning hands with soap and water or alcoholbased hand rubs; 2) Covering your nose and mouth with a tissue or flexed elbow when coughing or sneezing; 3) Avoiding contact with anyone who has flulike symptoms; 4) Avoiding unprotected contact with live wild or farm animals.

ocus on Human Rights — Human Rights Watch, an International Non-

Governmental Organization conducts research and advocacy on human rights and publishes reviews on human rights practices in nearly 100 countries. The report notes Australia has a strong record of protecting civil and political rights, but serious human rights issues remain including:




increasing threats to freedom of speech, and targeting of public servant whistle blowers and journalists; is critical of Australia's asylum-seeker and refugee policies, including the repeal of the Medevac Law in December; also condemns the high rate of Indigenous Australians in the criminal justice system, especially Indigenous children.

From the positive point of view, the report commends: Australia's more vocal stance on key human rights issues including China's detention of one million Muslims in the Xinjiang region; the announcement of the royal commission into violence, abuse, neglect and exploitation of people with disabilities; the Queensland government's introduction of a human rights act in October, becoming the third jurisdiction in Australia to do so behind the ACT and Victoria. ... I waited until we had our fortnightly meeting...to email you. I relayed your entire conversation to our Conference members and they were gobsmacked by the thoughtfulness of ... Stafford Added to this they couldn't believe you were so far geographically from us and had picked us out! They also loved the idea of the message of support on a card to be handed out. This last week has been incredibly hectic and we have had so many people affected by the fires coming in. Particularly those from Cobargo and the surrounding areas which were in the midst of a forest of trees. I think it has suddenly become a reality to those affected and they are more aware of what they have lost and how much they now need. They are also extremely tired, emotionally and physically. Some have had to be evacuated a second time which adds to their trauma. There have now been new warnings for tomorrow and Sat, so we have a lot of campers who have come into

Narooma and set up on an oval near the evacuation centre which at this stage is not needing to function as one. Please pass on to your parish and Con-
