



loved the idea of the message of support on a card to be handed out.
This last week has been incredibly hectic and we have had so many peo-



ple affected by the fires coming in. Particularly those from Cobargo and the surrounding areas which were in the midst of a forest of trees.

I think it has suddenly become a reality to those affected and they are more aware of what they have lost and how much they now need. They are also extremely tired, emotionally and physically. Some have had to be evacuated a second time which adds to their trauma. There have now been new warnings for tomorrow and Sat, so we have a lot of campers who have come into Narooma and set up on an oval near the evacuation centre which at this stage is not needing to function as one

ocus on Human Rights — Human Rights Watch, an International Non-Governmental Organization

conducts research and advocacy on human rights and publishes reviews on human rights practices in nearly 100 countries. The report notes Australia has a strong record of protecting civil and political rights, but serious human rights issues remain including: increasing threats to freedom of speech, and targeting of public



servant whistle blowers and journalists; is critical of Australia's asylum-seeker and refugee policies, including the repeal of the Medevac Law in December; also condemns the high rate of Indigenous Australians in the criminal justice system, especially Indigenous children.

From the positive point of view, the report commends: Australia's more vocal stance on key human rights issues including China's detention of one million Muslims in the Xinjiang region; the announcement of the royal commission into violence, abuse, neglect and exploitation of people with disabilities; the Queensland government's introduction of a human rights act in October, becoming the third jurisdiction in Australia to do so behind the ACT and Victoria. - Western regions rejoice as rain falls on drought-hit lands, bringing hope to farming communities and filling dams.
- Maronite Catholic siblings Antony, Angelina and Sienna Abdallah killed in Oatlands tragedy remembered for their devout faith at funeral.
- Faithful flock to pray with the relics of St Therese of Lisieux and her saintly parents Sts Louis and Zelie Martin visiting Brisbane archdiocese.
