This is the law and the prophets." — Matthew 7:12 — As we ponder the "golden rule", we remember that food waste is a clear sign of the inequality that exists in the world today. Enough food is grown globally to feed every person, but more than 821 million people remain undernourished due to a lack of equitable food distribution and waste. — According to the U.N. Food and Agriculture Organization, we could feed 2 billion people, more than twice the number of undernourished people across the globe, by reversing this trend.

you put "something" on the plate (Otherwise, they may get the impression that adults around them put nothing there and so they don't need to either.)

ARONAVIRUS PRECAUTIONS: - (these precautions are based on the latest information from the Qld Health Department)

Parishes should **refrain** from distributing Holy Communion from the **chalice** until further notice.

All ministers of Holy Communion should **wash** their hands before and after distributing

When exchanging the **Sign of Peace**, people should avoid shaking hands but say "Peace be with you" with some eye contact and perhaps an ap-

propriate gesture e.g. the Asian practice of joining hands and bowing toward the other in respect.

Parishes and other settings where liturgies are celebrated should make **alcohol based** gels or rubs (or like products) available near the entrances.

It is wise for people to **receive** Holy Communion **in the hand** rather than on the tongue.

ur LENTEN preparation for EASTER: Celebrating the Forgiveness of our Sins:

Why not celebrate our common Sinfulness and that God never ceases to forgive and show us mercy? On MONDAY 30th March, 7.00pm, we will celebrate the Second Rite of Penance. How to do that?? All those who wish to celebrate are asked to consider their sins, (spend some time reflecting on "why do I do

these things") and write them and your answer down on a piece of paper BEFORE coming to church that night (DO NOT include your name!!). The basic structure of the Second Rite is: Introduction, Liturgy of the Word, Liturgy of Penance and concluding



rite. During the Liturgy of Penance, you will process forward, hand your **OPEN sheet** of paper to Father, receive Absolution and return to your place.


A message of thanks received this week....

Now in its thirty-fourth year Centacare's Catholic Psychiatric Pastoral Care (CPPC) trains pastoral carers to support people with mental illness, through their spiritual and therapeutic ministry in hospitals, supported accommodation and our day Centre. CPPC is seeking Catholics with the ability to relate personally and spiritually to those suffering from mental illness.

The volunteer training course (provided cost free) runs each Wednesday 9:00am - 3.30pm, from 6 May to 27 November 2020. Upon graduating the Pastoral Carers give a voluntary commitment of 8 hours per week in either one of the above minis-

Taking extra precautions - Archdiocese of Brisbane recommends changes for parishes in light of the coronavirus (COVID-19) effective 5th March, 2020. These changes are on flyers at each entry point to our church. Please be aware of the changes particularly with receiving communion, holy water and greetings.

he retired Archbishop of Brisbane, John Bathersby, died on Monday March 9, following a recent stroke. Archbishop John led the Archdiocese from 1991 until 2011, retiring upon reaching 75 years of age. With his passing we recall with gratitude the episcopal ministry of our sixth bishop, which was characterised by a deep desire to know and love Jesus and to share this

with all. It is also a time of thanksgiving as now he is released from the debilitating illness that has been with him in these latter years. The liturgies that will usher Archbishop John into eternal life are being held at the Cathedral with a Funeral Vigil Liturgy at 5.00pm on Sunday March 15, Morning Prayer for the Dead in the



Blessed Sacrament Chapel of the Cathedral at 8 am on Monday morning, and a Solemn Funeral Mass and Rite of Committal at 11.00am on Monday (n.b no public parking available on this business weekday). 
Parish Leadership Development Day


