


Usually we would have had a flurry of crafty women making crosses for our Palm Sunday Masses. It's very

Phone a friend and do the Examen prayer together. We can grow as a faith community each day. Please share with us, what you are doing to stay in touch with one another. s a virtual parish, we celebrated a penance liturgy on Wednesday evening. It was wonderful to see so many join the Zoom meeting. About 80 devices were tuned in for the liturgy. Many were couples and a few families too. Fr Denis had done a lot of work to bring this to fruition. As we work to iron out some of the technical issues here in the parish office, there are a few tips for you at home.

#### Things we learnt from the liturgy on Zoom

- \* Singing doesn't always work well in an online group chat
- \* Muting the group is sometimes necessary!
- \* Start on time, just like Mass
- \* Use a sound to signal the beginning of our sacred time

#### Things for you to consider at home

(Also refer to Thursday's email)

- \* We are gathering for a liturgy so please show reverence and respect
- \* Finish that drink beforehand
- \* Remain quiet while Fr Denis is addressing the congregation, during readings and prayers

The **microphones on your devices are very sensi- tive** and will pick up any comments or conversations you may be having with the person next you.

The **cameras are always watching**, so be aware of the angle of your camera and any distractions in the background

What disappointed you today? Speak to God about this.


#### 4. Consider your Choices



DYED EGGS



- 1. Boil your eggs and let them cool
- 2. Take an egg, tap cracks in two sides of the egg (or go crazy and experiment with more!)
- 3. Pop the egg in a bag and put in a small amount of food dye (we recommend saving bread bags or food bags for this step)
- 4. Manipulate the bag so that the dye covers the whole egg, then gently put the egg out onto the drying rack.
- 5. Repeat for remaining eggs and colours
- 6. Leave to dry then gently peel off the shell to reveal your masterpiece!

#### Recycling Aluminium Foil

The Australian Aluminium Council reports that aluminium (unlike plastic) can be recycled endlessly without compromising any of its unique properties or quali-

ty. However, in order to be captured during the recycling process, the aluminium piece needs to be quite large - small pieces of Easter egg wrappings would be lost in this process, but you can fix this by:

Saving all your Easter egg wrappers and making them into one large Easter egg ball (at least a tennis ball size is preferred) Keeping an aluminium can and putting all small foil pieces into the can until it's full before popping it in the recycling bin.
