Hi all

I need your help. We have a **BASIC DECISION** to make that will be determined by the '**popularity**' of our three Mass times (Sat 5pm, Sun 7am and 9am) AND the **legal requirement** of '**social distancing**' and thorough **cleaning** of the building after each Mass. Another issue is that some will not be able to attend any because of their own health/vulnerability or that of their family. THEREFORE:

If you do NOT have email, please ring the Parish Office (3356 7155) BEFORE 11AM next Monday (29th) informing me which Mass is the preferred Mass you WILL be attending - Sat 5pm OR Sun 7am OR 9am. (Each is asked to choose ONE time only.)

Those with emails have already been asked and have until **11am Monday** to respond.

**Possible results** are: 2 Masses and a Zoom OR 3 Masses and possibly no Zoom. What are your thoughts about either alternative?

In line with the (current) Government social distancing guidelines, we are allowed a maximum of 100 people in attendance at Mass (including any people standing outside the church—so we aren't able to have any 'extras' stand there during Mass. As you will see

the seating has been re-arranged, hand sanitiser is provided and people are asked to 'sign in' to enable 'contact tracing'. Sadly any 'cuppas' after Mass won't happen and the kitchen and shop will remain closed.

See the above picture of our COVID-19 Church layout - which is an interim idea of how Entering and Leaving will be done and how we will manage Holy Communion. Providing there are no more Virus outbreaks and Rule changes, we will be physically gathering together again on the weekend 11/12th July.

**AND!!!** We will need at least one "Marshall" for each Mass.. Duties will include an OVERSIGHT of what's happening to ensure Covid-19 requirements are kept (especially when I'm away and there is a visiting priest). More details coming. Of course, we will thoroughly inform you what to do.

AND!!!! There will be some changes we will all need to get used to. We have not finalised procedures yet and would be keen for positive alternative suggestions that help us <u>celebrate good Liturgy</u> and ensure we obey the current Covid-19 restrictions. Some of

the things we are considering are happening everywhere in other parishes. e.g.

Remembering that we are required by law to know who is present at a Mass/function and have their contact details:

- People will have to "book in" for a particular Mass in the preceding week. Debra will allocate seats accordingly. **NO BOOKING = NO ENTRY**. (People with mobility issues and other "special" circumstances will be considered e.g "Grandma" and kids present but from different households. This all means you probably won't be able to sit in your **usual seat**.
- It may seem silly, but **Parish is responsible** for 'social distancing': **NOT in same household = 1.5m separation** (even if you arrive in the same car!)

Some parishes REQUIRE that everybody is present before the starting time. **If you're late, you lose your booking** and, providing maximum number has not been reached, 'speccies' will be allowed in.

You have experienced more regulation of movement at the shops and so you will already be familiar with a more regulated movement during the **Procession to Communion.** Looking at the map, you'll see the directions of movement, keeping at least 1.5m apart, and requiring you to sanitise your hands just before receiving. (There will be Sanitising stations just before you receive. Once you sanitise your hands, you are encourage to join them with your fingers intertwined so your hands don't accidentally touch anything before receiving.) ALL Communion will be on the hand and none on the tongue.

At least, I think, until we have a vaccine, this may be the **new 'normal'**. We are thinking long-term to avoid constant changing and are trying to ensure that how we worship is **Good Liturgy** AND in a way that does not harm those for whom the virus is potentially deadly. We are also trying our best to ensure that all are treated **equally and justly.** — Denis.

ow can you help us??

We need to fill a roster. Refer to the list to the left. Some of our regulars may not be attending Mass as they fall into the vulnerable category. Please don't wait to be asked, if you can help with any of the usual roles please do so. If you've always wanted to know why the Air Stewards smile so much, offer to be an usher. You can have all the power and tell people where to sit and how to

exit the aisle when we touch down!

If you are new to the roster, please register as a volunteer on the https://archbne.org/welcome. This needs to be completed before any roster begins. Please contact me in the office by phone or email to volunteer. Thanks in advance, Debra

All marshalls/ushers will need to have some training/ information about the role they play at Mass.

#### In summary

- Volunteer for the next roster
- Book in for Mass
- Contact Tracing sheet completed
- Social distance from others
- Use Hand Sanitizer
- Arrive with enough time to be seated by usher
- Leave promptly after Mass

After you leave this is what happens

- All seating that is used, is cleaned before next service
- All hard surfaces are cleaned
- All altar ware is cleaned before next service
- Toilets are cleaned

This policy applies to Clergy, Religious, Staff, Parishioners, Volunteers, students on placement and Visitors to our sites.
