HERE IS A SUMMARY OF OUR PROPOSALS:

Safe and Connected Communities

- 1. Increase investment in Community Neighbourhood Centres as the backbone of our community infrastructure for the 21st Century:
- 2. Immediately increase emergency response capacity through funding a full time "Brief Intervention Social Support Worker" for each community neighbourhood centre to respond to the Covid pandemic: \$14.5 million per year.
 - CHURCH HOPE JUNITY VOICE SUNION JUSTICE HOPE SUNITY FRANKSING COMMUNITY OF THE PROPERTY OF THE
- 3. Queensland Community Neighbourhood Centre Enhancement
 Strategy including co-design, pilot and rollout:
- 18 month Co-design/co-creation phase -\$1.5m
- 12-18 month Pilot phase –\$2.05m
- Rollout phase \$14.5million per year.
- 4. Provide a Community Organising Capacity Fund

- to train 600 community workers and leaders over 4 years: \$1.5 million over 4 years.
- 5. Develop a new strategy for addressing Social Isolation and Loneliness with a whole-of-person, wholeof-community and whole-of-government approach.
- 6. Commit to developing and implementing a new strategy for addressing Social Isolation and Loneliness.
- 7. Undertake a Parliamentary Inquiry into Social Isolation and Loneliness, within the first 12 months on new parliament, to form the basis of this strategy:
- 8. Secure funding for Ways to Wellness pilot in Mt Gravatt for 3 years (\$300,000).
- A Welcoming New Queenslanders package that addresses specific issues raised by CALD communities for people seeking asylum, digital divide in education, the reporting of workplace mistreatment, and addressing Domestic and Family Violence (D&FV).
- 10. Provide income support and other social safety nets for Finally Determined cohort facing destitution during COVID crisis i.e. approx. \$4 million over 6 months.
- 11.Grants via application processes for schools to enable CALD families to access digital equipment and data in anticipation of home-schooling due to further COVID waves. Fund community grants programs for digital education for CALD families.
- 12. Fund community organisations to provide work rights education to new Queenslanders and assistance to vulnerable migrant workers about issues. This will complement the commitment of Alliance organisations to provide workplace rights information in relevant languages and develop training for community champions.
- 13.Long term investment to build capacity in CALD communities to be partners in the prevention of Domestic & Family Violence.

Real Jobs for a Real Future

- 1. Create direct public employment through State Government and Local Government, specifically targeting those who have lost jobs and hours through the pandemic.
- 2. Use direct public employment to stimulate private demand by creating 3000 new jobs in state and local governments, specifically targeting those who have lost jobs & hours through the pandemic. \$100 Million.

Renewable Energy Superpower Package

- 1.Fast-track 3 Renewable Energy Zones (REZ) in Darling Downs, Fitzroy and North Queensland with a \$300m package, and explore connected renewable industry precincts.
- 2.Mandate increased investment by Qld's Government Owned Companies in renewable generation:
- 3.Increase the budget of CleanCo to ensure it reaches its 1GW mandate by 2025.
- 4. Change in mandates of CS Energy and Stanwell Corporation:
- 5.Allow them to investment in renewables.
- 6.Set a level of renewable investment in their mandate at 1 GW.

- 7.Enhance grid stability through a Virtual Power Plant based on the South Australian model. While ensuring that this operates on a fully integrated and coordinated basis to ensure functioning of the system across generation, transmission and distribution.
- 8. Cutting electricity costs through renewable energy
- 9.A package of measures to permanently reduce energy costs and stimulate economic demand. The total package would cost \$200M and include:
- 10.Expand solar on social housing to cover one-third of Queensland's social housing units. Approximately \$100m, creating 500 direct installation jobs.
- 11. Significantly expanded Interest-Free Loans for Solar and Storage for households to install solar and batteries in priority areas for energy demand.
- 12. Time-limited expansion of rebates for energy-efficient appliances, including heat-pump hot water and Peaksmart air conditioning, refrigerators and washing-machines.
- 13. Energy efficiency grants and loans to manufacturing companies and tourism/accommodation providers.
- 7. Living Wage Foundation

Fund the establishment of a Living Wage Foundation to enable civil society and consumers to lead a movement that makes Queensland jobs secure and appropriately paid. \$300,000 per year for 3 years.

Adel Dut was chased from her home by fighting in Sudan's Darfur region, but a church agency gave her some sorghum seeds to plant outside the village of Ferdous, where she



lives in a camp for displaced families.

The conflict in Darfur was dubbed by some as the first climate war. While conflicts had long existed between nomads and settled farmers in the region, long-term drought and the expansion south of the Sahel — brought on by climate change — pushed the two feuding groups into closer proximity. With the government providing guns to one side, the fight over land soon took an even deadlier toll.

Amid the violence, farmers like Dut did what Jeremiah counseled centuries before, when hope grew dim in his world. She planted seeds. Despite the drought and the fighting, she put seeds in the ground, and it transformed her. When I met her, she didn't act like a victim. She was proud that she could heal a little corner of her homeland by planting seeds.

When we become overwhelmed by violence in the world around us, we would do well to remember Dut.

For reflection and action: The coronavirus pandemic has upended our personal and community lives, changing the way we live, worship and interact with one another. Many people feel isolated, stressed and alone. What seeds can we plant to help transform this desert experience into a life-giving garden of hope?


