
ying Peacefully—No Euthanasia Sunday

There are many misunderstandings about what dying entails and how the Catholic Church teaches one should respond to it. This Sunday October 11 is a day that might help clear up some of that confusion.

We need to tread lightly and carefully in making laws about end of life. We must be careful not to cause more suffering under the illusion that we are ending it. Legislation around euthanasia or voluntary assisted dying will be considered in Queensland early next year,

so this is an important issue to consider as we prepare for the state election on October 31.

ear Terry,
I am now President of the Narooma Conference, the very grateful recipients of Our Lady of the Apostles Parish's most generous donation for our bushfire victims.

After quite a terrible year with Covid following so soon after the bushfires and local floods (whose rain helped our local volunteer firies put out the fires), recovery slowly commences. Your donations helped our Conference provide much assistance. A generator, temporary accommodation, beds, bedding, clothing, tools, water pumps and a saddle just name a few of the items you have provided to our victims. And special thanks must also be given to the children, teachers and parents of your parish school for their letters, drawings, prayers and good wishes for the Cobargo community.

Yesterday the Archbishop of Canberra- Goulburn Archdiocese, the Most Reverend Christopher Prouse visited the Cobargo Parish to say Mass and bless the newly re-installed bell tower of the Church.

The ceremonies were followed by a Covid style picnic in the recovering grounds with BYO picnic and chairs the order of the day. I thought your members and parishioners might like to see some pictures of the day.

Thanks to your Parish, this beautiful metal (note it's not wood) fence replaces the one lost by the neighbours of the church who managed to save St Mary's from the approach-

ing fires. Here our Conference Treasurer is with just one of the victims who have been given temporary rescue accommodation by the same generous neighbours. You can see that the land is beginning to recover even if not as well treed! I think you can see why the folks of Cobargo chose this area to make their homes.

Terry, this is just a small sample of the good things our Conference has been able to do thanks to the generosity of your Conference and Parish. We still have a little left for the recovery effort which will be very valuable over the coming months.

Please pass on our immense gratitude to your members, parishioners, school community and Father Denis.

'day Denis -I wanted you to know first: I'm voting against the mobile phone ban bill.

I was on the fence about it, because I thought there were some good points and bad points to the bill. I asked the public what they thought, and I got over 100,000 people write back to me.

96 per cent of them wanted me to vote no.

To be honest, the sheer numbers for and against aren't the only thing I took into consideration when I made this decision to oppose the phone ban bill. But it was an important one.

If you want to learn a little more about the results, the responses I got (from people both for and against), and what I thought about each of them, I've written up a big detailed document on my site HERE.

Can I just say, I've found this exercise really useful. It's made me think much harder about where I sit on different things and it's given me a chance to actually engage with voters in a way you just don't get when everything is going through the filter of journos or politicians trying to look good in front of the cameras. I got to hear how people felt, read why they felt that way, do my research into the reasons given for and against, and get a sense of where I stand in a way I really couldn't have done without this. I hope you found this process useful too. I'm working really hard to find ways to give people like you a way right into

the heart of decisions made in Canberra. I'm not always going to get it right, but I'm trying. If you've got thoughts on how to make it work better next time, I'm all ears. Thanks for sharing your views with me. I really, honestly appreciate the way you've come on board with this.


