S THE PARISH STILL RELEVANT? Read Pope Fran-



cis' thoughts (Evangelii Gaudium para 28) below:

The parish is not an outdated institution; precisely because it possesses great flexibility, it can assume quite different contours depending

on the openness and missionary creativity of the pastor and the community.

While certainly not the only institution which evangelizes, if the parish proves capable of self-renewal and constant adaptivity, it continues to be "the Church living in the midst of the homes of her sons and daughters". This presumes that it really is in contact with the homes and the lives of its people, and does not become a useless structure out of touch with people or a self-absorbed group made up of a chosen few.

The parish is the presence of the Church in a given territory, an environment for hearing God's word, for growth in the Christian life, for dialogue, proclamation, charitable outreach, worship and celebration.²⁷

In all its activities the parish encourages and trains its members to be evangelizers. It is a community of communities, a sanctuary where the thirsty come to drink in the midst of their journey, and a centre of constant missionary outreach.

We must admit, though, that the call to review and renew our parishes has not yet sufficed to bring them nearer to people, to make them environments of living communion and participation, and to make them completely mission-oriented.

Please share with your Parish Council any thoughts you have about how the Parish will journey into the future after the turmoil of COVID.

Celebrating the Forgiveness of our Sins:

Why not celebrate our common Sinfulness and that God never ceases to forgive and show us mercy? On THIS TUESDAY 30th March, 6.30pm, we will celebrate



the Second Rite of Penance. How to do that?? All those who wish to celebrate are asked to consider their sins, (spend some time reflecting on "why do I do these things") and write them and your answer down on a piece of paper BEFORE

coming to church that night (DO NOT include your name!!). The basic structure of the Second Rite is: Introduction, Liturgy of the Word, Liturgy of Penance and concluding rite. During the Liturgy of Penance, you will process forward, hand your **OPEN sheet** of paper to Father, receive Absolution and return to your place.



The Care for Creation Group invite you to journey **The Stations** of **The Cross - Good Friday at 10am.** Bookings essential.

Taster Ceremonies with be STREAMED ON ZOOM for those who cannot be here in the church. As you know, we all celebrate as actively as possible (we don't just watch!) because we all share the Priesthood of Christ and His prayer is our prayer. To enhance your Easter Celebrations, I ask you to prepare the following:

For the **Sacrament of Penance (next Tuesday),** write out "why" you do what you do, join in the Liturgy and destroy your list afterwards.

For **Holy Thursday**—have some **bread** and **wine** on a table consume all or part of it (share it) during Communion time. If you are with others, conduct some **act** of **service** during the washing of the feet.

For **Good Friday**—have a **Cross** readily available and **venerate** it in some was as we do at church. If it is physically possible, **stand** during the reading of the **Passion**.

Easter Vigil — Have a **candle/light** that you can light when the congregation lights their candles. Have a **bowl** of **water** ready to be blessed as we bless the Font; Have **bread** and **wine** available as per Holy Thursday.

FOR THOSE WHO WILL BE AT THE CHURCH

(BOOKINGS ESSENTIAL esp for Good Friday and Easter Vigil):

PASSION (PALM) SAT/SUN: There is a Procession of the Palms and you will need to be seated in your seats at starting time (5pm and 9am) - please book as this helps everyone.

HOLY THURSDAY (7PM) - the beginning of our Triduum - please be present before starting time (and book!!)

GOOD FRIDAY (3PM) - Our Triduum continues - please book (this is a popular ceremony and you may miss out!) - ("Stations of the Cross" at 10am)

year's Liturgies. PLEASE book and be present 10 minutes before starting time - we need everyone in their seats before the Liturgy of Light begins which is adapted for COVID reasons.

ALSO - please bring some BELLS - any sort! We will

do plenty of bell ringing at various parts of the ceremony.

EASTER SUNDAY (9AM) - Similar to most Sunday Masses with a couple of extra "Easter" touches. Please book and be on time.

THE READING OF THE PASSION (this Sunday AND Good Friday) – to stand or not to stand? Depends on your physical ability/health – it goes for



around 15 minutes. To sit is a passive posture. To stand is more active which and more appropriate as *the Passion is Our*Story not just a story being read to us. If

your health dictates, you might even decide to stand for a while, take a break by sitting and then stand again???

Booking for Liturgies in general (e.g. normal weekend masses) – it is much PREFERABLE that, if you think you are going to be at a particular Mass, you book and then find you cannot attend — rather than not book and then turn up having to complete contact details and then be allocated seats (often with 1 minute to go before Mass starts!). If you book and find you cannot attend, send me an email –

pp.stafford@bne.catholic.net.au and if I read it before Mass, I can inform the Marshalls and make your booked seats available if they are needed. **Make it a habit** to do your bookings for the following weekend at the same time on the same day each week (BEFORE WEDNESDAY 3.30pm).
