



Easter Ceremonies with be STREAMED ON ZOOM for those who cannot be here in the church. As you know, we all celebrate as actively as possible (we don't just watch!) because we all share the Priesthood of Christ and His prayer is our prayer. To enhance your Easter Celebrations, I ask you to prepare the following:

For **Holy Thursday**—have some **bread** and **wine** on a table consume all or part of it (share it) during Communion time. If you are with others, conduct some **act** of **service** during the washing of the feet.

For **Good Friday**—have a **Cross** readily available and **venerate** it in some was as we do at church. If it is physically possible, **stand** during the reading of the **Passion**.

Easter Vigil — Have a candle/light that you can light when the congregation lights their candles.—Be careful with naked flames!! (Maybe you could turn the lights in your house on gradually as we do in church??) Have a bowl of water ready to be blessed as we bless the Font; Have bread and wine available as per Holy Thursday.

IS THE PARISH STILL RELEVANT? Read Pope

Francis' thoughts (Evangelii Gaudium para 28) below:

The parish is not an outdated institution; precisely because it possesses great flexibility, it can assume quite different contours depending on the openness and missionary creativity of the pastor and the community.

While certainly not the only institution which evangelizes, if the parish proves capable of self-renewal and constant adaptivity, it continues to be "the Church living in the midst of the homes of her sons and daughters". This presumes that it really is in contact with the homes and the lives of its people, and does not become a useless structure out of touch with people or a self-absorbed group made up of a chosen few.



The parish is the presence of the Church in a given territory, an environment for hearing God's word, for growth in the Christian life, for dialogue, proclamation, charitable outreach, worship and celebration.²⁷

In all its activities the parish encourages and trains its members to be evangelizers. It is a community of communities, a sanctuary where the thirsty come to drink in the midst of their journey, and a centre of constant missionary outreach.

We must admit, though, that the call to review and renew our parishes has not yet sufficed to bring them nearer to people, to make them environments of living communion and participation, and to make them completely mission-oriented.

Please share with your Parish Council any thoughts you have about how the Parish will journey into the future after the turmoil of COVID.
