

SOCIAL JUSTICE STATEMENT 2021—2022

This year's Australian Bishops' Social Justice Statement will be launched on August 5th of 2021 with the theme Cry of the Earth, Cry of the Poor. The statement affirms that "we human beings need a change of heart, mind, and behaviour" and draws from Scripture, from the theological tradition, from Catholic Social Teaching, and from the wisdom of the world, including the insights of the First Nations.

One year ago today the chief law officers from Commonwealth, state and territory governments met and failed to take any action to end the appalling practice of locking up children as young as 10 years old.

They promised to meet again and progress the issue. Instead, they have kicked the can down the road leaving almost 500 children to languish behind bars between 2019 and 2020.

We must not let them get away with doing nothing. That's why we're asking you to contact your state or territory **Premier or Chief Minister** and remind them just how many of us support changing these outdated and harmful laws.

We're asking you to take two actions today:

Send an urgent email to the Premier or Chief Minister of your state or territory and urge them to



#RaiseTheAge to at least 14 years old. We've got all the details you need, click here to send your email now.

All the medical evidence tells us that any contact with the criminal justice system can cause lifelong harm and leads to higher rates of adult incarceration, homelessness, mental illness and even premature death. Every day ten year old children are behind bars is a travesty. A whole year of inaction is unacceptable.

Take action now: click here to contact your state or territory Premier or Chief Minister and call on them to change these damaging and harmful laws.

There is a better way.

There are alternatives all over the country that are changing children's lives for the better and making our communities safer. From learning on country programs in Western Australia, to trauma-informed mentoring in Victoria and wrap-around, culturally safe family supports in the ACT: this is where governments should be investing our taxpayer dollars – not locking tiny children in concrete cells.

Send an email right now to your Premier or Chief Minister and urge them to #RaiseTheAge without any further delays.

1 In 5 Australians Forced To 'Improvise' On Period Products

We conducted a Bloody Big Survey and 125,205 great Australian's responded. What we found out was extraordinary and quite simply eye-opening. The most alarming finding is that more than 1 in 5 (22%) people who menstruate have had to improvise on period products due to the cost.

We never imagined the magnitude of the issues and would welcome you to take a read. The Period Pride Report: Bloody Big Survey Findings, which is based on the surveys responses, is now live and accessible via our website.

We always say the most powerful way you can help Share the Dignity is to use your voice 'socially speaking' to shed a light on all things menstruation and period poverty.

For years we have had anecdotal evidence of period poverty but this report now means we have the data to help us in our advocacy work,



better inform the public on these issues and influence government policy.

What happens to your car tyres after replacement?

Tyre Stewardship Australia is a non-commercial organisation created to implement the national Tyre Product Stewardship Scheme – a system that puts responsibility for the sustainable management of tyres at their end of life on the companies that manufacture them and the retailers that dispose of them.





The scheme is funded by the

industry, but it is not compulsory, which is why it's so important for consumers to be informed. In 2020, the eight tyre importers funding the scheme represented approximately 43 per cent of the market. You can use your purchasing power to support retailers and manufacturers that are taking responsibility for their products

Milk Bottle Top Recycling Update:

Thank you for the great response to milk bottle top collection, we have made significant start in our effort to reduce plastic from land-fill. We are collecting the **LDPE #2** or **HDPE #4** caps for the Ocean Crusaders <u>oceancrusaders.org/recycling/</u> repurposing program.

The caps are manufactured into blocks that can be used like giant Lego blocks to build garden walls, sheds, benches etc. It is important that the caps are caps, foam insert removed and colour sorted. To help you with this we have placed colour coded milk containers on a trolley at the back of the church. Your support in sorting the caps at the collection point means we can more effi-

ciently pass them onto Ocean Crusaders.

We inherited a box of caps and were so glad to save them from Land Fill.....it took quite some time to transform the chaos to meet the requirements!
