The Social Justice Group, in working towards a "Reconciliation Action Plan" (RAP) have revised out "Acknowledgement of Country". It is hoped that besides our Weekend Masses, all groups meeting in our Parish might use it at the start of their meetings for the reasons below.

What is 'Acknowledgement of Country"? Why do we have it?



An 'Acknowledgment of Country' is a way that all people can **show awareness and respect for Aboriginal** 



and Torres Strait Islander culture and heritage, and the ongoing relationship the traditional owners have with their land. Both Indigenous and non-Indigenous people can perform 'Acknowledgement of Country'. It is a demonstration of respect dedicated to the traditional custodians of the land (or sea) where the event, meeting, school function or conference takes place. It can be formal or informal.

**Our new wording** before our Weekend Masses and other important celebrations:

"We begin by acknowledging the Yugarabul ("yuger-ra-bull") People. The custodians of the land on which our church and homes were built. We pay our respect to elders past and present, and thank them for passing down their knowledge and wisdom."

He is the only one who can lead us home.







Milk Bottle Tops: We have had a great response to our call for milk bottle tops. Just a gentle reminder that we do need to have them cleaned before placing in the receptacles in the church. The dry milk is stubborn when just rinsing under the tap, don't forget to remove the foam insert too. May I suggest popping them in the dishwasher, top shelf or in with your cutlery. We are collecting the LDPE #2 or HDPE #4 caps for the Ocean Crusaders oceancrusaders.org/recycling/repurposing program. The caps are manufactured into blocks that can be used like giant Lego blocks to build garden walls, sheds, benches etc.

#### SOCIAL JUSTICE STATEMENT 2021—2022

This year's Australian Bishops' Social Justice Statement will be launched on August 5th of 2021 with the theme Cry of the Earth, Cry of the Poor. The statement affirms that "we human beings need a change of heart, mind, and behaviour" and draws from Scripture, from the theological tradition, from Catholic Social Teaching, and from the wisdom of the world, includ-
