The Social Justice Group, in working towards a "Reconciliation Action Plan" (RAP) have revised out "Acknowledgement of Country". It is hoped that besides our Weekend Masses, all groups meeting in our Parish might use it at the start of their meetings for the reasons below.

What is 'Acknowledgement of Country"? Why do we have it?



An 'Acknowledgment of Country' is a way that all people can **show aware**-

ness and respect for Aboriginal and



Torres Strait Islander culture and heritage, and the ongoing relationship the traditional owners have with their land. Both Indigenous and non-Indigenous people can perform 'Acknowledgement of Country'. It is a demonstration of respect dedicated to the traditional custodians of the land (or sea) where the event, meeting, school function or conference takes place. It can be formal or informal.

Our new wording before our Weekend Masses and other important celebrations:

"We begin by acknowledging the Yugarabul ("yuger-ra-bull") People. The custodians of the land on which our church and homes were built. We pay our respect to elders past and present, and thank them for passing down their knowledge and wisdom."



It is with great excitement and enthusiasm that joint convenors Catholic Religious Australia and Catholic Mission Australia write to invite you to register for the fifth National Mission Conference **Mission:** one heart many voices 2021. We know that COVID-19 doesn't discriminate, but it always seems to show up for Dignity Drive.

We're all sharing those feelings of angst, uncertainty and frustration around the unknown and the impacts of this on our lives.

Since the pandemic began, I have had many quiet moments weighing up how we can get through this for the women and girls that need our help. How to continue our work and fulfil the 168,000 product requests that we have received, whilst ensuring the safety and wellbeing of our dedicated volunteers.

Knowing each time that there are women and girls across Australia relying on our help who are now going to go without.

I said to my team a few years ago, that I didn't want to be the charity that's always asking our community to donate money through emergency appeals, and I have had to battle with my own inner compass to even be able to communicate this to you today.

Can you help us? Just \$5 could help to provide a packet of period products to a woman in need. Mary is a courageous woman who fled her abusive husband with her two sons. "I once used a tampon from the floor of a public bathroom," Mary told me. All living together in her car, Mary sacrificed period products to be able to feed her children. When I heard this story, I was astounded. To think that even one woman would have to do something so undignified. The scary reality is, there are many other women like Mary out there. Can you help today, for the women like Mary? New South Wales and Victoria are consistently two of our three largest states for collecting products during our Dignity Drive. But we know due to the latest lockdowns and restrictions, this won't happen this time. These states have done so much for Share the Dignity, and it's time we return the favour. Rachel.

The dry milk is stubborn when just rinsing under the tap, don't forget to remove the foam insert too. May I suggest popping them in the dishwasher, top shelf or in with your cutlery. We are collecting the **LDPE #2** or **HDPE #4** caps for the Ocean Crusaders <u>oceancrusad</u>ers.org/recycling/ repurposing program. The caps are manufactured into blocks that can be used like giant Lego blocks to build garden walls, sheds, benches etc. The Piety Shop has moved into the parish **office foyer.** The piety shop has a large range of gifts for children celebrating the Sacraments of Confirmation and First Eucharist including gift cards.
