This Sunday, the second last Sunday of October, is World Mission Day – established by Pope Pius XI in 1926. This year's theme is: "We cannot but speak about what we have seen and heard" (Acts 4:20). In his message Pope Francis said: "We know that the call to mission is not a thing of the past, or a romantic leftover from earlier times. Today too Jesus needs hearts capable of experiencing vocation as a true love story that urges them to go forth to the peripheries of our world as messengers and agents of compassion." "He addresses this call to everyone, and in different ways. We can think of the peripheries all around us, in the heart of our cities or our own families. Universal openness to love has a dimension that is not geographical but existential." All this year we have been reading from the Gospel of Mark which has as recurring theme the meaning of discipleship. The disciples are called and then sent. The missionary disciple knows Jesus and lives a life wanting to share the love of Jesus with others. Mark's Gospel has two stories of healing blindness. Some commentators divide Mark's gospel into five acts. The two stories of the blind are the beginning and end of the fourth act. The first

He saw people but they were like trees walking around. Then Jesus touched him a second time to restore his sight fully. The second blind man has his sight fully restored immediately. Over the past two weeks we have read stories about the challenges we face when committed to missionary discipleship. They are the same as the temptations presented to Jesus in the desert, although we have to go to Mathew and Luke's gospels for the detail. Mark simp-

ly says Jesus was tempted. The three temptations were, firstly, to material things – turn the stones into bread; secondly, to power - fall down and worship the devil to have power over all the kingdoms; and thirdly, to fame and prestige - throw yourself off the parapet of the temple. Two weeks ago, we read the story of the rich young man. He found it hard to be a disciple and went away sad because he was very wealthy. Jesus replied by saying how hard

blind man was touched by Jesus and had partial sight.

it is for a person whose heart is set on wealth to enter the kingdom. Last week we had the story of the two disciples, James and John. They wanted to be seated on the left and the right of Jesus in the places of power and honour. They made the other disciples angry because they wanted all the attention


Discipleship has to overcome any tendencies to place our trust in wealth (if only I had more money, all would be well), power (if only I was in charge, things would be different), or fame and prestige (if only I was somebody my life would be different). Today we read a story that presents the opposite set of values – the values that mark true discipleship. A detail in the story that is important is the

fact that the man throws off his cloak. This is symbolic - he comes with nothing. The custom in those days was for a beggar to sit on his cloak and the cloak was the way in which he gathered the offering that people made. He casts this aside, stands before Jesus bare and no longer de-



pendent on the gifts of others - and unlike the sons of Zebedee who come with pretensions to power, or the rich young man who could not give up his wealth, he is not dependent on his own resources. He is now trusting fully in Jesus. As missionary disciples we are open to the gifts of God, to live our lives fully, without pretensions to power or expecting recognition or under the illusion that our wealth will give us

This is a free course and is done online. The course will take around 30 minutes to complete. A certificate is issued at the completion of the course. Send



Care for Creation

Last Sunday parish took part in a global Faith 4 Climate Justice action, where we prayed for our civic leaders to act swiftly and bravely to address Climate Change. Parishioners united in a pledge to petition our Federal MPs pointing out the dire need commit to net zero carbon emissions before 2050. World Leaders will

gather at the United Nations Conference on Climate Change COP26 at Glasgow from 30th October. It is not too late to voice your concerns to your MP.

Here is a starter, to help you formulate you letter. Make it your own. Be factual, courteous and firm.

Dear

As a member of your electorate, I am writing to you to express my serious concern at our Federal Government's mediocre response to the disaster of Climate Change. I implore you to encourage our government to send our Prime Minister to the upcoming Glasgow COP26. Australia

must be a leader in action to stem the disaster of climate change. Our country is rich in resources not just mineral, but more importantly the wealth of brilliant minds and inventive, creative people who are well equipped to map a future which does not depend on fossil fuels.

It is imperative that Australia is a leader in climate action, that we protect the diversity in our environment and that we support our nation and our neighbours.
