COMMUNION PROCESSION CHANGES: From this weekend we are reverting to the PRE-COVID processions (for the time being without the Blood of Christ). This means that:

- those in AREA A will process forward from the FRONT SEATS along the aisle near the windows and then return to their seats via the Aisle between areas A and B.
- Those in AREA D will process behind Area C via the aisle between Areas C and D (starting from the REAR SEATS) and return via the aisle between Areas D and E. (Musicians at the Organ, if rostered, go to one of the ministers in the centre aisle)
- Those in AREAS E and F will continue as we do now. (Musicians, if rostered in Area F AND Computer people, go the minister serving this area)

When the **ideal**, that is Communion under the forms of bread AND wine, is restored we will adapt some more.

Synod Consultation

In February a small group of parishioners met to consider the three themes of the synod - Communion, Participation and Mission. Although it



was a small group, the conversation was lively, and the topics generated much discussion. These were the responses generated and sent to the National Team for consideration.

Communion

Our group felt that our Parish Community is doing a good job of encouraging us to "walk together". We are a "Community of communities" and this should be encouraged. However, we all felt that we are not listened to by the Church hierarchy and pray that this synod will make a difference. Past experiences. Such as *Hearts on Fire* and *Jubilee 2000* make is sceptical of **real** change. We hope and pray that there will be courageous, candid and responsible discussions of issues that are in the forefront of many Australian Catholic minds e.g

- Married priests,
- women integrated into the Church hierarchy and given voice,
- no discrimination and dignity and acceptance of all regardless of sexual orientation or marital status
- inclusive language,
- consideration of the language of the mass in Australia

We acknowledge the difference COVID has made to participation and involvement and wonder how Church will be different in the future.

Participation

In responding to the questions, we discerned the following:-

Goals are set by a few in leadership with little consultation with individuals in the Church. Any steps for taking them forward is left for the individuals to discern on their own. The model of church is still perceived as hierarchical with the bishops and priests exerting authority. Evaluation is infrequent and often ad hoc. Little, if any, feedback on outcomes is communicated. Parish councils and teams, where they exist, reach out to their communities with little guidance or support.

Decisions are made by a few and do not always represent the views of everyone. Often decisions are made before consultation begins. A patriarchal model still exists where it seems some believe that they know best and that the general assembly knows little. This does not take account of the levels of education and theological studies undertaken by many lay persons. Church documents need to be mindful of lay persons and use language that educates, informs and invites action. The recent documents from the Vatican, e,g Laudate Si, have been very accessible and have encouraged action without the imprimatur of clergy. This has been challenging for some as it is seen as a loss of authority. Using the KISS (Keep It Simple) principle is beneficial.

At local level the Parish council uses the shared wisdom model to promote full participation of council members, but sometimes cultural mores promote the primacy of clergy as some cultures are conditioned to a hierarchical model rather than a more devolved model where all the baptised are the Church and can have voice.

Mission

What is the mission, and what is the message?

First we confront a personal challenge of faith. Not so long ago the focus wasn't on Christ's love, but dos and don'ts, the sins done in thought or deed. Many people have long given up or looked for simpler answers elsewhere.

For those who stay or become catholic, if we believe we profess God's love, and have duty to share this, is it not demanded we live it? How can we true followers of Jesus if won't love everyone? We exclude people who are divorced, or don't fit the traditional sexual stereotype?

Women are excluded from the most senior leadership, celibacy is demanded, and no one can explain the benefit to a sceptical and educated youth who self-exclude from formal vocations.

There is no question that as a faith/church/ community we have given so much, through schooling, hospitals and community support such as SVDP. Our church has a history of well-intentioned good deeds.

The immense damage of human frailty and poor leadership has blighted us.

The 'modern' history of Australia is largely a secular story. This is a great benefit to our church as we can and be viewed against other faith s on the merits of our message and how we live it. Do we really understand those other faiths and what they offer?

Why must change go through a group of aging male bishops? Change is stifled for decades or more. Many people take their own path. For those who stay, we try and live a Christian life, accommodating as much as is palatable for modern living as is possible, while being a Catholic. How is that a compelling message?
