Second Rite of Penance. <u>How to do</u> <u>that??</u> In this Lent, where we have been considering how we are agents of **division** rather than followers of Christ's way of **COM-MUNION**, you may wish to reflect on how you do both. (Spend some

time reflecting on "why do I do these things") and write them and your answer down on a piece of paper BEFORE coming to church that niht (DO NOT include your name!!). The basic structure of the Second Rite is: Introduction, Liturgy of the Word, Liturgy of Penance and concluding rite. During the Liturgy of Penance, you will process forward, hand your OPEN sheet of paper to Father, receive Absolution and return to your place.






