From Fr Denis:

I will be away on Renewal Leave from this Saturday (30th) to Saturday Aug 6th. I will do a bit of reading and participate in a couple of retreats and other formative events. Looking forward to the break!

In the meantime:

- The Parish Missional Council will continue to support you all as we try to be more "missional", more outreaching as we live "Christ's way" to the world. The Executive (or the whole Council) will be consulted regarding any new activities that affect the whole parish.
- The Parish Finance Council will continue to over oversight to our finances, support the payment of bills and supervise the material wellbeing of our parish. They will make decisions re unexpected large expenses and any other extraordinary events.
- Day to day administration will be in the hands of Debra (she does it all anyway!) in the Office (Mon, Tues 9am-3.30pm, Thur 9am-1pm).
- The grounds and regular maintenance will continue to be looked after by Mark and Kerry.
- Also, the Presbytery and the Church are both in much need of minor repairs and painting. This has been organised and will START pm Thursday 5th May. This means the church will be UNAVAILABLE for any services for the weekdays from 5th May until 20th May unless otherwise advised. WEEKEND MASSES will be as usual but possibly with some large machinery parked to the side. Past generations have built these buildings. We need to ensure they are 'healthy' for the future.
- The Sacramental Team will advertise and run the Confirmation and Eucharist Preparation programmes when the time comes.
 (Basically, this is supporting parents in their prime responsibility of "training their child(ren) in the faith".)
- The Musicians and Singers will continue to plan for our Liturgies, practise their gifts and support you all in worship with good and prayerful music remember: they SUPPORT you in song your job is to sing up as best you can.
- The Computer people will continue to ensure those at home can join us in worship via ZOOM and those in the church building can respond and sing wholeheartedly.
- These and so many others (visitors to TriCare, "Social Gathering" people, Coordinators, Sacristans etc etc will generously and faithfully continue to serve you all.)

- Our school, guided by an excellent leadership team, will
 continue to thrive and provide its excellent education and
 formation of our children. Of course, as with everything,
 this is in cooperation with their parents and carers,
- You will be really blessed with the gift of Fr Tom Elich (Welcome Fr Tom) will preside at Weekend Masses, Anointings and Baptisms.
- Other priests have generously volunteered to look after Funerals and emergency visits to Tri-Care.
- It's wonderful that the spirit of "gathering for prayer" will continue with some of you leading and attending Weekday Liturgies here at Stafford on Tuesdays 8.30am and Fridays
 9am.
- You still have access to the celebration of Weekday Eucharist at Kedron, Mon, Tues, Thurs, Fri 8.00am, Wed 9.00am.

We in Stafford Parish have long recognised that **EACH and ALL of** us are what makes our Parish alive and healthy. As you can see from the above, a Parish is not the priest, and a parish can be healthy and alive without his presence (something to remember as our church faces huge challenges over the next 10 years or so)



Some Information about Islam (who are also children of Abraham):

"Eid-Ul-Fitr" is celebrated by Muslims on 3rd May:

Also called the *Festival of the Breaking of the Fast*, this religious holiday is celebrated by Muslims worldwide and marks the end of the month-long, dawn-to-sunset fasting of Ramadan. The date is based on the sighting of the new moon by religious authorities and therefore varies from place to place.

Special prayers are said, generally at communal gatherings in open areas or large halls or mosques. Charitable donations, called Zakat, are given to the poor. It is a time of family celebrations and feasting with special foods according to the local cultures. The traditional greeting to all at this time is "Eid Mubarak"

Registration of Volunteers in ministry

- Children's Liturgy of the Word
- Sacramental Program
- Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion to sick (hospitals etc or private residences)
- Care and Concern—home visits

SAFEGUARDING POLICY

"The Church loves all her children like a loving mother, but cares for all and protects with a special affection those who are smallest and defenceless. This is the duty that Christ himself entrusted to the entire Christian community."

(Apostolic Letter issued 'motu proprio' by the Supreme Pontiff Francis, 4 June 2016)

Purpose

To promote a culture of safeguarding within the Archdiocese and reduce the risks of abuse and harm.

Scope

This policy applies to all parishes, ministries, and agencies under the jurisdiction of the Archbishop of Brisbane and to Associations of Christ's Faithful or Public Juridic Persons which freely opt in to its application and which enter into an agreement with the Archdiocese accordingly. The policy applies to all Archdiocesan workers (including clergy, religious, employees and volunteers).

Policy

National Catholic Safeguarding Standards

The Archdiocese adopts and adheres to the National Catholic Safeguarding Standards. The Standards apply to all parishes, ministries, and agencies under the jurisdiction of the Archbishop.

Safeguarding Commitment

The Archdiocese has zero tolerance for all forms of abuse and is committed to safeguarding everyone involved in its activities, ministries, and services. The safety and wellbeing of children and adults-at-risk is paramount.

Safeguarding Principles

- Safeguarding is a shared responsibility.
- Treat everyone with dignity and respect.
- Prioritise the protection and best interests of children and adults-at-risk.
- Provide safe physical and online environments.
 Actively identify and manage safeguarding and abuse risks.
- Monitor compliance with safeguarding standards, policies, and procedures.

Respond promptly and effectively to abuse concerns, suspicions, disclosures, complaints, reports, and incidents.

Comply with all legal obligations to report suspected


