Dear Parishioners and Visitors.

"Happy Mothers Day ~ to all Mums and Care-Givers!!!"

"Mum, look I am drawing a picture of God." "But no one knows what God looks like," responded the mother. The child handed her the drawing of a heart. God is love. We learn of this love through the Son. We know God when we love. Jesus speaks of the deep love He has for His disciples: "As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you." So deep is His love for us that He calls us friends and offers us a dignity beyond our expectations: "This is my commandment; love one another, as I have loved you." To even consider that we have the power and the capacity to love in this way is staggering.

We all need to become 'lovers'. Love is willing the best for another person. Love is communicating with another. Love is a commitment to be with and for other people. Love is the sharing of joy, interest and understanding. Love is union. Can we really convey the love Jesus encourages us to have and to offer? This love (agape) has its beginning in God. Love, then, consists in this: not that we have loved God, but that He has loved us. How astonishing. It is an overwhelming concept to be loved by Him and to be called to love as Jesus loves!

Once there was a young man who was having doubts about the existence of God. So one day he paid a visit to a monk who had a reputation for holiness. He asked the monk, "So you believe in God?" "Yes, I do" the monk answered. "On what evidence do you believe?" asked the young man. "I believe in God because I know Him. I experience the presence of God within me every day." "But how is that possible?" the youth asked. "When we love, we experience God, and doubt vanishes like early morning mist before the sun," replied the monk. The youth thought about this for a while, then said, "How can I achieve this kind of certainty?" "By acts of love," came the reply. "Try to love your neighbours, love them actively and unceasingly. As you learn to love them more, you will become more and more convinced of the existence of God and the immortality of the soul. This has been tested. This is the true way." The monk was echoing the words "My dear friends, let us love one another, because love is from God; everyone who loves is born of God and knows God. Whoever does not love does not know God, for God is love."

Love is the best teacher we have. But it does not come of its own accord. It often demands many years of persevering toil before a person can reach the point where he or she is able to love. There is a big gap between knowing God and loving God. Not to love is not to know God. But when we love, the gap is closed. To love is to know God. Where love is, God is; where God is, love is. There is no prerequisite for loving God. We don't have to be theologians, or Scripture scholars, or liturgical experts to love God and to know God's love. We are all capable of loving God and experiencing God's love. This is

God's gift to us and our gift to God and our neighbours.

Because we are all made in God's image we each have an innate capacity for love. For this to happen the heart needs to be right. We need to heal the wounds of the heart in order to produce the fruits of love. "" Sister Josita

Registration of Volunteers in ministry

There have been changes to the requirements of the various ministries in parishes some time ago. We do still encourage all volunteers to register on the Welcome Portal (link below). However, there are only a select few ministries that still require a Working with Children Card (Blue Card) and a Police Check. These include the following areas of ministry in our parish

- Local Safeguarding Representative
- Pastoral Council
- Finance Council
- Children's Liturgy of the Word
- Sacramental Program
- Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion to sick (hospitals etc or private residences)
- Care and Concern—home visits

SAFEGUARDING POLICY

"The Church loves all her children like a loving mother, but cares for all and protects with a special affection those who are smallest and defenceless. This is the duty that Christ himself entrusted to the entire Christian community."

(Apostolic Letter issued 'motu proprio' by the Supreme Pontiff Francis, 4 June 2016)

Purpose

To promote a culture of safeguarding within the Archdiocese and reduce the risks of abuse and harm.

Scope

This policy applies to all parishes, ministries, and agencies under the jurisdiction of the Archbishop of Brisbane and to Associations of Christ's Faithful or Public Juridic Persons which freely opt in to its application and which enter into an agreement with the Archdiocese accordingly. The policy applies to all Archdiocesan workers (including clergy, religious, employees and volunteers).

Policy

National Catholic Safeguarding Standards

The Archdiocese adopts and adheres to the National Catholic Safeguarding Standards. The Standards apply to all parishes, ministries, and agencies under the jurisdiction of the Archbishop.

Safeguarding Commitment

The Archdiocese has zero tolerance for all forms of abuse and is committed to safeguarding everyone involved in its activities, ministries, and services. The safety and wellbeing of children and adults-at-risk is paramount.

Safeguarding Principles

- Safeguarding is a shared responsibility.
- Treat everyone with dignity and respect.
- Prioritise the protection and best interests of children and adults-at-risk.
- Provide safe physical and online environments.
 Actively identify and manage safeguarding and abuse risks.
- Monitor compliance with safeguarding standards, policies, and procedures.

Respond promptly and effectively to abuse concerns, suspicions, disclosures, complaints, reports, and incidents.

Comply with all legal obligations to report suspected


