The Most Holy Trinity - Year C 11th/12th June, 2022

Reflection on the readings

Translating is an art. The Scriptures are not simply literary relics of long ago but crucial components in a living dialogue, which makes translating them complicated. Reading the Scriptures has a vital role in private study and prayer, but the main conversation with them takes place in our liturgies. For this we do not simply pick up the Bible: the Lectionary is a liturgical book that assembles passages in particular combinations for these living encounters. With no biblical event to found the feast of the Holy Trinity and with no passage explicitly teaching trinitarian theology, no text automatically suggests itself for use on this theological feast. This year's second reading, Romans 5:1-5, does refer to Christ, and God (usually understood as the Father), and the Holy Spirit, but not in an explicitly trinitarian way as theology would later clarify it. So also the gospel, John 16:12-15, which more easily fits before rather than after Pentecost (and indeed is read every year on Wednesday in the Sixth Week of Easter, and forms the second part of the alternative reading for Pentecost Sunday in year B).

However, various passages do have traditional trinitarian, christological, or pneumatological interpretations and are chosen for the Lectionary accordingly. Problems then arise when the translation



of the Bible used, for the Lectionary follows different translational principles, resulting in a nuance that may not fit with the reason for its selection. The Jerusalem Bible employed in our current Lectionary in Australia, and the NRSV too, presents such a problem in the first reading, Proverbs 8:22-31. The text personifies Wisdom, but Wisdom is not one of the named three persons in the triune Godhead, so does it refer to Christ, or the Spirit, or neither? One of the gifts of the Spirit is wisdom, which is not the same as Wisdom personified. With few exceptions, English does not employ grammatical gender, so when dealing with languages that do, native English speakers often confuse grammatical masculine and feminine with being sexually male or female; they trip on the fact that in both Hebrew and Greek (and Latin) the word for wisdom is feminine, and so they claim this Wisdom cannot be Christ and must be the Spirit which is feminine in Hebrew (but neuter in Greek, and masculine in Latin). This rationale is forgotten when calling Christ the Light, also feminine in Semitic languages and Latin, and neuter in Greek. Grammatical gender is of no avail. Both the Church's Eastern and Western wings have traditionally identified the Wisdom of Proverbs 8 with Christ,

and the obvious textual relationships with the prologue of John's gospel reveal why.

The problem then manifests in our translation (and the NRSV) when it says "The Lord *created* me", which contradicts what we say of the Son, that he was "begotten, not made". The Hebrew verb has several nuances, *create* being among the lesser used. A more common nuance is *possessed*, as adopted in the Vulgate (*posseidit*), giving a literal reading as "The Lord possessed me, the beginning of his way, before his works from of old". Its precise meaning being somewhat elusive, rendering it clearer results in varied translations. The Greek Septuagint, reflecting pre-Christian Jewish interpretation, reads "The Lord made me the beginning of his ways for his works", which does not cause the difficulty of the above-mentioned approaches. Both Greek and Latin versions of this line and what follows fit with John's prologue, which presents Christ as the world-shaping Word the Father speaks in the Bible's first account of creation. Both texts inform the traditional designs of icons of creation; the one measuring and shaping the cosmos is not a depiction of God the Father, whom no-one has seen, but is clearly clothed as Christ and bears his face, recognisable from other icons. However, Proverbs 8 also seems to speak of two being present, God working with Wisdom at his side. This can still be interpreted as God the Father directing and Wisdom fabricating, for Wisdom is also called "master craftsman" and is described as being at play both in God's presence and in the world. But it may also work with the image that envisages the Son and the Spirit as the "two hands" of God at work in the world.

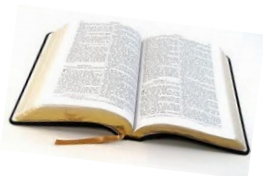

Rain or shine, Logan deanery brings families together at festival day

A TURN of bad weather was not enough to keep away more than 1000 people from eight parishes across Logan Deanery and the wider community from gathering for a day of face-painting, music, craft and food at Family Festival in Logan City last month.

Organising committee member Josephine Cullen said the day had been in the works for about a year.

A last minute change in weather the day before meant three food vans pulled out of the event, but Underwood Lions Club came to the rescue with a sausage sizzle and a pizza van showed up too, she said.

She said they were "so blessed to have these wonderful people say 'yes'".

"Within a half hour (of opening), people were streaming in and we ran out of car-park," she said.



"The most amazing part of this evangelising event to showcase the good the Church does is that people were registering and showing expressions of interest in the schools in the area and looking for a faith community to belong to.

"This we hope will support the parishes in evangelizing and making contact with these people who gave their contact details."

She said the team gathered together at the start of the day in prayer and offered the festival to God.

"We had come so far in our planning that it was a project the whole team came together with and believed in," she said.

"Everyone from marshals to car park attendants were amazed at the amount of people coming on this day."

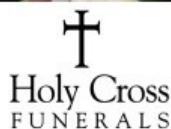
