thentic; by contrast, all the texts on discipleship from ancient Judaism and Christianity suppose that one joins a group as a disciple. One can only be really 'one of them' when you are part of, accepted by, and in harmony with a group. The next step is to think about individualism - and how it affects religion.

"Individualism" was a notion first mentioned in the mid-nineteenth century by Alexis de Tocqueville in his

reflection s on American society, when he described it thus:

Each person, withdrawn into himself, behaves as though he

were a stranger to the destiny of all the others. His children and his good friends constitute for him the whole of the human species. As for his transactions with his fellow citizens, he may mix among them but he sees them not; he touches

them, but he does not feel them; he exists only in himself and for himself alone. And if on these terms there remains in his mind a sense of family, there no longer remains a sense of society." (A de Tocqueville, "Democracy in America - NY, 1945 p45"

In this perspective, only the individuals are "really real" and clubs, associations, co-operatives, groups of friends - anything which is a team activity for humans – not to mention any notions that we are social animals, society, or humanity

¹⁴ Now the body is not a single part, but many. ¹⁵ If a foot should say, "Because I am not a hand I do not belong to the body," it does not for this reason belong any less to the body. ¹⁶ Or if an ear should say, "Because I am not an eye I do not belong to the body," it does not for this reason belong any less to the body. ¹⁷ If the whole body were an eye, where would the hearing be? If the whole body were hearing, where would the sense of smell be? ¹⁸ But as it is, God placed the parts, each one of them, in the body as he intended. ¹⁹ If they were all one part, where would the body be? ²⁰ But as it is, there are many parts, yet one body. ²¹ The eye cannot say to the hand, "I do not need you," nor again the head to the feet, "I do not need you." ²² Indeed, the parts of the body that seem to be weaker are all the more necessary, ²³ and those parts of the body that we consider less honorable we surround with greater honor, and our less presentable parts are treated with greater propriety, ²⁴ whereas our more presentable parts do not need this. But God has so constructed the body as to give greater honor to a part that is without it, ²⁵ so that there may be no division in the body, but that the parts may have the same concern for one another. ²⁶ If [one] part suffers, all the parts suffer with it; if one part is honored, all the parts share its joy.



- are just accidental and secondary. This individualist view sets up a polarity between the individual and the society – and I such a polarity the individual has to look out for herself or himself (and, if lucky, strike a deal for mutual nonagression and perhaps for even better trading with those around). Since the later Middle Ages it has become ever more acceptable not only in society but within religion....

We utter again and again the word "covenant" or speak of our relationships with God, but do not note that our ancient documents speak of God having chosen a people, and

so the relationship is with that community rather than 'us', a collection of individuals who happen to have the same perception about God's presence in their lives. ... (This paradigm shift of perception) "constitutes one of the primary challenges of Christian believing today." ... the disciples as we read about them are more than just loners in the same school. They form 'the school'. The school - all those disci-

ples together – is the reality and the disciple is a part – a member of this bigger body and cannot exist apart from it. The part depends for its existence on the whole - and the whole is more than the sum of the parts. (Read and reflect once again on Paul's image of the Body of Christ)


