Some points about the Aboriginal Lord's Prayer:


Some people have asked me where it has come from. It originates from the Broome Diocese which has a high population of Indigenous



people, including many for whom English is a 2nd, 3rd, 4th or even more language. It was formulated and composed to enable the Diocese to be more inclusive and to enable many different languages to celebrate as one. (There is also an "Aboriginal Eucharistic Prayer"). The indigenous Christians will use it whenever there is a mixture of languages present at Eucharist so that all can be involved. We need to get special copyright permission (as opposed to most copyright, this costs us nothing) every time we use it. The next time we will be using it is for our Feast Day celebrated on the 12/13th November.

BREAK OPEN THE WORD contains readings and psalms for each Sunday with NEW commentary providing fresh and insightful background to the text and assistance on how to read it, along with a section entitled "The Ministry of Reader". The popular pronunciation guide is also included. Break Open the Word is a vital

publication for readers. They are still \$24 per book.

Catholic Leadership Intensive Course News

This project will reach out to existing parishioners to re-engage them with Church, initially with Christmas and Easter campaigns, followed by some locally provided opportunities for personal spiritual development.

Brisbane's Multicultural Mass a celebration of our shared and equal humanity

BRISBANE Archbishop Mark Coleridge has delivered a rousing message of equality and inclusion during this year's Multicultural Mass at St Stephen's Cathedral.

Representatives from more than 30 cultural communities celebrated the diversity and vibrancy of their Catholic faith traditions, just as they have done for more than half a century.

As in previous years, the Mass coincided with the World Day of Migrants and Refugees and following the liturgy participants enjoyed a variety of traditional food and a display of cultural dances in the Cathedral grounds.

Delivering the homily, Archbishop Coleridge spoke of the natural, God-given equality of every human being.



"That's what the Bible proclaims," he said, referring to the Gospel reading about the rich man and Lazarus (Luke 16:19-22:25).

"... this rich man in the Gospel wasn't necessarily a bad person – we don't know – but he was a human being caught up in ... a very bad culture which said that some people were unequal, inferior and therefore not to be seen and not to be heard.

"Now the same can be true of us without us even realizing it.

"Earlier this week I was up in Townsville at the assembly of the National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Catholic Council and for a very long time in this country the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples have in fact been invisible and inaudible.

"That's why it's important that we talk now about them having a voice to the national parliament being heard, not inaudible anymore.

"So there on our doorstep, at our front gate, is a classic example of a world that treats some people as unequal, inferior, invisible, inaudible."


