Reconnecting our parish

Following the Leadership Intensive course the parishioners who attended have already met to plan how they might support and strengthen our parish. We wish to capitalise on this energy and

enthusiasm. Our NCLS data shows that we are a highly relational parish but that connection with parish has declined by 50% since the onset of Covid. This project



is aimed at reconnecting with those parishioners who have not returned to Sunday worship following Covid as well as reconnecting more broadly within the community. This project will reach out to existing parishioners to re-engage them with Church, initially with Christmas and Easter campaigns, followed by some locally provided opportunities for personal spiritual development. The Queensland Premier recently released the government's response to the Treaty Advancement Committee Report. As part of the state's <u>Path to Treaty</u> initiative, the treaty will be a signed, negotiated agreement between First Nations peoples and the

Queensland government. The options being discussed include whether a treaty will take the form of a single treaty for the whole

state or individual treaties with specific Aboriginal and Torres Strait

All 22 of the Committee's recommendations were either accepted

in full or in principle by the government. Similar to Victoria, the

Bottle Top Collections

Single use plastics are a danger to our environment and to us. They are not biodegradable but they do break down, eventually becoming tiny pieces of plastic that enters the food chain. Sea birds, turtles, fish and aquatic mammals ingest the plastic, often resulting in animal death. Because plastic particles cannot be digested and excreted from the body, large fish like shark, marlin and tuna store the toxin in their body; people who live on a fish based diet are at risk of plastic toxin overload.

We can help stop the plastic waste pollution of the oceans by collecting and recycling our milk bottle tops. Our Care for Creation Group encourages parishioners to collect their milk bottle tops and deposit them in the container provided at either the Parish Office or outside the church after weekend Masses. Caps need to be LDPE or HDPE (low/high density polyethylene) these are #2, #4 on the recycling chart.







Remove the foam inserts from inside the lid, wash in warm, soapy water, keep your caps in a clean dry place and drop them off to us each month

Thanks to the regular contribution of our parishioners, we have amassed another impressive load of bottle tops which will be delivered to the recycle program.



Keep saving the plastic bottle tops; we put out our collection trolley on the third Sunday of each month, coinciding with our cuppa after Mass.


