### Reconnecting our parish

Following the Leadership Intensive course the parishioners who

Our NCLS data shows that we are a highly relational parish but that connection with parish has declined by 50% since the onset of Covid. This project is aimed at reconnecting with those parishioners who have not returned to Sunday worship following Covid as well as reconnecting more broadly within the community. This project will reach out to existing parishioners to re-engage them with Church, initially with Christmas and Easter campaigns, followed by some locally provided opportunities for personal spiritual development.

Our family came to Stafford Parish from Townsville, in the latter part of 1998. One of our daughters was gravely ill, requiring ongoing treatment at the Brisbane Children's Hospital. Our transfer to Brisbane was swift and had the potential to be most unsettling

for our three children aged at that time, three, five and 7 years. We placed our concerns in God's hands and set about finding a school and new parish. After having secured a place in the Queen of Apostles Primary School for our daughter, I went on to the Parish Office to introduce myself and enquire about the sacramental program. The welcoming reception and gentle listening ears of empathy offered by Rosemary Haydock, was the answer to our prayers. The Parish Vision "To follow the example of Jesus, by serving others" was absolutely apparent on that very first day! Christ


### Registrations for The Cathedral Seminars: The
