Australia Day Reflect. Respect. Celebrate.

Changing our "Acknowledgement to Country".

Over time, **our knowledge changes and improves our understanding of the world around us**. In our learnings this often challenges how we have understood things to be. At mass, as part of our invitation to all, we offer an acknowledgement to Country. This practice ties us to the traditional custodians and places around Brisbane.

Recent advice, from Traditional custodians has meant that we need to change our Acknowledgement. The advice indicated that we need to include acknowledgement to the **two large clan groups from Brisbane's northside and near south side of Brisbane** – the **Turrabul** peoples and the **Yuggera** peoples. Both groups have custodial obligations to the country around Brisbane and, where our parish and homes are built. The new wording for our Acknowledgement will, therefore, be as follows:

We acknowledge the Turrabul (too ra bull) and Yuggera (yug er rah) peoples, custodians of the land on which our homes and church are built.

We also acknowledge elders, those past and those present, and thank them for passing down their knowledge and wisdom to us.

Lenten Discussion Groups

This year our parish will offer Lenten Discussion Groups on Mondays and Fridays following morning Mass and Monday evenings via Zoom. The Zoom sessions are an opportunity for families to pray and reflect together. If your child/ren have received the sacraments of Communion and Confirmation, this Lenten program would be a perfect opportunity to further explore as a family, the opportunities we have to live our lives in light of Catholic teachings. We will draw inspiration from the text from Ashes to Hope and the input and discussions will be age appropriate.

The daily reflections will invite the reader to contemplate a verse from the Scripture reading of the day. This reflection will be followed by a quote (usually by Pope Francis) and a simple prayer.

The daily reflections will only require a few minutes for an individual to read, reflect and pray on.



Why it's important to be settled in before Mass starts:

One of our visiting priests is **amazed and very grateful** that Stafford Parishioners are **all present and ready** to celebrate Mass together **on time** (and even 10 or so minutes early!). His reaction is not just because he's got a thing about being punctual but for **more serious and important reasons**, namely:

- We celebrate the real presence of Christ in three ways at Mass (this is spoken about in one of our Eucharistic Prayers: "Blessed indeed is your Son, present in our midst when we are (1) gathered by his love and when, as once for the disciples, so now for us,(2) he opens the Scriptures and (3) breaks the bread." We need to be "gathered" from the start!
- The Mass is something we DO TOGETHER (the priest does NOT "say Mass" while we "follow") – we are a Body and are disabled a little when we are not all present. As someone once told me "God has given each of us only a certain time in this life and others have no riaht to waste ours!"

 Practically, we often spend the few minutes before starting time (5pm Saturday, 9am Sunday) to learn new hymns or be reminded of hymns we may have forgotten. (Singing is a part of our Mass and is something we all do together regardless of how "good" our voice is.)

• The "Gathering Hymn" has a purpose – it helps unite us by our joining in singing it together, it prepares us to celebrate together and it opens our hearts to God's Spirit in preparation for receiving Christ in the Word proclaimed.

• If you are consistently late, your mind is not in tune with the congregation assembled while you find a seat and get settled, it disturbs our worship of God, distracts us from listening to the Word, and means that you miss the introduction which often focusses on a particular aspect of our faith that we wish to celebrate at this particular Mass, or maybe gives some input to help understand the readings.

NOTE: We're human and sometimes there is a dirty nappy, a flat tire, an alarm that didn't go off or some other reason we may be occasionally late. That's understandable. It's just important for all of us not to be USUALLY late or just on time!
