Lent's a shuddery season, Lord -all those ashes and purple and talk about penance and mortification and self-denial.

A gloomy time --

I know the glory-light of Easter is at the end of it, but does Lent have to be so rugged?

Well, beloved, it's rugged if you make it so. Haven't you missed the point of self-denial in Lent, of what the penance and mortification is really about?

You see, it's not for its own sake. And it's not an obstacle course that has to be run. It's not an endurance test either. And yet my people so often see Lent as something to be endured.

Lent is not giving up, beloved - it's giving. Lent is putting yourself out for others, when it is really hard for you to do this.

Lent is having an honest look at yourself,

tearing out the selfishness in you and developing the selflessness. Lent is denying the evil in you, not letting it have its way.

Lent is purifying yourself, cleansing yourself, so that I might shine through you more and more clearly. Lent is not only not for its own sake -it's not really just for your sake either.

Lent is for making me more present in you, and through you in the lives of those in your life. Lent is me growing in your life, sometimes painfully. And remember, beloved - Lent is only the way. Lent ends in Easter --


the way of the Cross becomes the goal of the Resurrection. And in your Lent you are not alone, all my people walk with you -and I walk with you.

Children in Detention



In the news recently there has been a lot of discussion about youth crime and detention. Children as young as 10 are arrested, tried and detained in prison. In just one year almost 600 children aged 10-13years were imprisoned in Australia. First Nations children are disproportionately impacted.

Children thrive when they are supported and nurtured in a loving environment. They develop p confidence in themselves and the society in which they live when they have the benefit of education, healthy relationships with their peers and security of shelter.

Child imprisonment has a long tradition in Australia, yet the statistics clearly show that it has not reduced child crime. There is another solution and it is up to the citizens of Australia to advocate for the rights of children and to bring about change.

The national **#Raise the Age** alliance is actively working to make positive change for children in detention, for society and for the health of our nation.
