Our LENTEN preparation for EASTER: Celebrating the Forgiveness of our Sins:

Why not celebrate our common Sinfulness and that God never ceases to forgive and show us mercy? On <u>TUESDAY 28th March, 6.30pm</u>, we will celebrate the



Second Rite of Penance.

How to do that?? In this Lent, where we have been considering how to make more space for God in our lives, you may wish to reflect on the ways you have no time for God but fol-

low other God's.

(Spend some time reflecting on "<u>why</u> do I do these things") and write them and your answer down on a piece of paper BEFORE coming to church that night (DO NOT include your name!!).

The basic structure of the Second Rite is: Introduction, Liturgy of the Word, Liturgy of Penance and concluding rite. During the Liturgy of Penance, you will process forward, hand your **OPEN sheet** of paper to Father, receive Absolution and return to your place.

ROSTERS:

HERE IS A *REALLY* IMPORTANT THING I'M ASKING YOU TO CON-SIDER -- please make yourself available for one of the Easter Liturgies especially the Easter Vigil - Saturday 8th April at 7pm. Things to consider:

- There are more ministries required than usual (including Readers and other "unique" ministries for the Vigil.) As usual "**Churchbox**" assumes you are AVAILABLE for your chosen ministries -- It is most important that if you are not available, you mark yourself as "**Unavailable**" in Churchbox --it'd be a tragedy if someone was rostered but did not turn up. The need to set yourself "Unavailable" is **the usual** procedure where you help us all by **marking for yourself** the Masses every weekend that you cannot serve. (If you are **not sure how to set yourself "unavailable"**, please see instructions **below**).
- There will be some ministries during the Easter Liturgies e.g. "Jug" we will have to **manually allocate**, so don't worry about them.

How do I record dates and times when I am not available?

From the '**Rotas**' tab select the '**Your Availability'** menu. You will see the dates and times of all the services and your availability. Click on '**Change**' to update your availability.

Safeguarding Representative whose role it is to ensure that the whole parish is aware of the importance of safeguarding children and vulnerable adults; promote safe practices including articulating for others what is appropriate and inappropriate behaviour; and assist the Parish Priest and staff in the implementation of the Archdiocesan Safeguarding Children and Vulnerable Adults Policy in the Parish.
