Lamps Ablaze: Apostolic Priorities for the Archdiocese of Brisbane

Priority Two: Reshaping Parish Communities

"Our current structures are based upon the facts of an earlier time and our current mode of provision is unsustainable. In the cities at least we have too many parishes and too many churches. Urban parishes were established on the assumption that people had to be able to walk to church and at a time when the numbers attending Mass were much larger. Many of our parishes are pressed financially and cannot provide the range of services which a missionary Church requires. Therefore, we need - sensibly and over time - to move towards larger configurations of a community of communities where the concentration of personnel and the sharing of resources would allow a greater range of services for the sake of the Gospel."

From Vatican II Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, Ch2:Para 14 "The Promotion of Liturgical Instruction and Active Participation":

Mother Church earnestly desires that *ALL the faithful* should be led to that **full, conscious, and active participa-tion** in liturgical celebrations which is demanded by the very nature of the liturgy, and to which the Christian people, "a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a redeemed people" (1 Pet. 2:9, 4-5) have a **right** and **obligation** by reason of their baptism.

In the restoration and promotion of the sacred liturgy the full and active participation by all the people is **the aim to be considered before all else**, for it is the **primary** and **indispensable source** from which the faithful are to derive the **true Christian spirit**.

The Summit is a key step in the implementation phase of the Plenary Council and where Archbishop Mark will be sharing his priorities for the years to come.


The Summit will include:

Thank you to all who have signed up. We are still looking for more volunteers to visit Tricare Stafford Lake to bring communion to the residents. We visit in pairs between every 4 and 6 weeks, and currently have 34 residents receiving a visit. Some are former parishioners.

Not all of these take communion, some preferring just to have a chat. The amount of time spent with each resident is up to the volunteer. Training will be provided for the role and a "cheat sheet" of short prayers is also available. You could initially be buddied with an existing volunteer. All volunteers must complete the Safeguarding process as determined by the Archdiocese, which includes a Police Check. This is a rewarding ministry and the residents appreciate the visits

and look forward to them.
