NEWS FROM DENIS:

My retirement has been approved. When? As of the end of this year. Where will I go? No idea but the Archdiocese is helpful in these matters.

More importantly, what's the future for our parish?

The Parish is the Parish – not the priest -- as we can see with all the work our Parish Missional Council is doing with the wider parish "in light of current social and ecclesial climates to better reflect how we respond to today's challenges and how we and other parish ministries may work together" – a quote from their report this weekend.

What's to happen with our beloved Parish as we move forward?

There are **two bodies** involved in supporting the parish in

The College of Consultors (A body of Bishops, Priests and Lay men and women who advise the Archbishop on planning options for the Archdiocese among other things)

Two members of the College of Consultors will come out to the parish in about a month to run a listening session with the parish to gather some understanding of who the parish is and what its needs are. This is usually advertised in the parish newsletter for the 2 weekends prior to the session.

There are generally two questions that are posed to the parish:

- 1. Over the years, what are the things you have done well as a parish community?
- 2. Looking into the future, what are the goals you think you should set for yourselves as a parish community?

This informs their discernment process for the new appointment for the parish and allows the parish's voice to be heard.

"Evangelisation Brisbane" and its support with Strategic

Planning Process (which our Parish Missional Council has already begun)

The Archdiocese recognises the significant lay leadership that exists within our parish and sees it for the gift that it is. They understand that role of the baptised in the mission of the Church is critical for our parishes into the future and needs to be encouraged. Therefore, as we step into this time of transition for our parish, the Archdiocese wants to support parishes through these transitions whilst seeking to work alongside the current work of the Parish Missional Council. In light of this announcement of my retirement, Evangelisation Brisbane would like to offer additional support to the Parish Missional Council and will look to meet with them soon to discuss how best to move the parish and all it's doing through this current time of transition.

As discernment is undertaken for any new appointment of a parish priest, the unique gifts of this parish are going to taken into consideration and there will be an opportunity for the parish to speak to its strengths and hopes for the future in the discernment process.

Lamps Ablaze: Apostolic Priorities for the Archdiocese of Brisbane

Priority Six: Implementing Integral Ecology

Natural and human ecology interact in mysterious and unmistakable ways. To interfere with one is to interfere with the other; to promote the good of one is to promote the good of the other. Fratelli Tutti (a recent Papal Encyclical) focuses more upon human ecology in speaking of the radical interconnectedness of all human beings at a moment when alienation and polarisation are making disconnectedness seem the norm. The Church is called in such a moment to be a sign of contradiction, speaking in a way that rises above politics and economics so that a genuinely biblical and Christian voice can be heard.






Why I will be voting Yes in The Voice referendum

My understanding of The Voice is that it will be a mechanism to advise Parliament on Indigenous issues, so that our elected representatives can make more informed decisions on these issues. As such, I see The Voice is a big step forward on the journey to reconciliation. This is something that has come from Indigenous people – the outcome of years of discussion and consultation – and it is not something that has been imposed on them. Of course, not all Indigenous people are in favour of The Voice (it would be impossible for this to be the case, as Indigenous people are not a homogenous group and naturally there are different viewpoints), however I believe a majority do support it – which was confirmed in a poll that was taken in January.

I also think that The Voice will provide significant help with "Closing the Gap" – and ensuring that the gap remains closed as well. While there has been some progress, much more is needed to ensure that all targets are met, and these improvements are sustained. *Kathleen O'Brien*




Finding the Heart of the Nation: The journey of the Uluru Statement towards Voice, Treaty, and Truth
