
## **REGISTRATION LAUNCH**



# Leave a Legacy Remembering your parish in your Will


"Your light must shine before all so that they may see goodness in your acts." (Matthew 5:16)

The recommended wording for a gift in your Will to your parish is:

"I give [insert amount/percentage/asset/item] to The Corporation of the Trustees of the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Brisbane for the use and benefit of general charitable, religious and educational purposes of the Our Lady, Queen of Apostles situated at 70 Appleby Road, Stafford 4053. In the event that the parish has changed its name or been amalgamated with another parish or parishes, this gift shall be given to the parish which at the date of my death incorporates the major area of the Our Lady, Queen of Apostles -Stafford Parish as it exists at the time of making of this Will."





My Reflection: The Voice to Parliament

Have you ever been in a situation where you have credible, professional, and experiential knowledge to share about a subject, but you

are not given an opportunity to share because someone 'louder' has the floor?

In such a situation I have left disappointed, knowing that the outcome will not be as favourable as it might have been and that the truth of the problem remains. I know my knowledge is valuable, but it will not be heard until respectful dialogue becomes the rule.

Since colonisation of Australia, the First Nations People have experienced the very same discourtesy. Detailed historical, scientific, and anthropological research has proven that for sixty millennia, Aboriginal People have lived and cared for this great land. Their spirituality is intrinsically connected to country; they are 'of this land'. European colonisation and dominance effectively became the 'louder person' and has stopped the precious exchange of knowledge that is key social cohesion in Australia. In the Uluru Statement from the Heart it is called "The torment of our powerlessness".

Later this year, we will be invited to make change in our country so that the First Nations Voice will be enshrined in our Constitution. I know that this is a serious decision, one which requires openness, dialogue, and discernment. To help me I simply ask 'What would Jesus do?"

"A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. John 13:34

The Word has spoken, and with this as my guide I can confidently vote YES in the Voice to Parliament Referendum.

**THE REFERNOUM QUESTION**: with all the confusion and fearmongering, **what is the ACTUAL question we will be voting on?** Here it is:

In recognition of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples as the First Peoples of Australia: There shall be a body to be called the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Voice. — If "YES" wins, the Constitution will change as follows: (My underlines—Denis)

The Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Voice <u>may</u> make representations to the Parliament and the Executive Government of the Commonwealth <u>on matters relating</u> to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples;

<u>The Parliament</u> shall, subject to this Constitution, have power to <u>make laws</u> with respect to <u>matters relating</u> to the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander <u>Voice</u>, including its composition, functions, powers and procedures.

That's it—no compulsion for Parliament to do what the Voice recommends and the Parliament itself will decide on its "composition, functions, powers and procedures". If we don't like what the Parliament decides, we

vote them out at the next election.—this is backed by the overwhelming legal opinion of our Constitutional lawyers.


