

of God. The Sea of Hands was first used in October 1997 in front of the Parliament House, Canberra is an iconic symbol of Reconciliation, a way for communities around the nation to engage in Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander issues.

A gold coin donation will help offset the cost of the hands. The hands are recycled, and will be returned to ANTAR.

Next Sunday's Readings Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time 15-16 July

First Reading: Isaiah 55:10-11 The rain makes the earth fruitful.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 64:10-14

The seed that falls on good ground will yield a fruitful harvest.

The Introductory Rites at Mass

The Introductory Rites at Mass consist of entrance song, greeting, penitential act or blessing/sprinkling of holy water, Gloria and collect prayer. The two essential elements are the first and last of these.

The purpose of the Introductory Rites is to gather people as a worshipping community and prepare them to listen to God's word and celebrate the Eucharist worthily.

The entrance song begins the Mass and announces that we are here to worship God as members of the Body of Christ, so it is very important that all join in the singing.

The sign of the cross that follows proclaims that we gather to celebrate as a community baptised in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

The liturgical greeting ('The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ...') states that the presence and power of the Lord is with the gathered community.

The most commonly used form of the penitential rite is option C. It is an acclamation of the mercy and compassion of God ('You heal the wounds of sin and division'), not a time for selfaccusation.

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal describes the Gloria as 'a very ancient and venerable hymn the text of which may not be replaced by any other text'.

The final element of the Introductory Rites, the collect or opening prayer, begins with the invitation by the priest 'Let us pray'. In the silence that follows we offer our own prayers which are gathered up in the words of the collect.

The Liturgy of the Word at Mass

The Liturgy of the Word is the first of the two central parts of the

This quote from Lectionary for Mass: Introduction expresses beautifully the role of scripture in worship:

The Church is nourished spiritually at the table of God's word and at the table of the Eucharist: from the one it grows in wisdom and from the other in holiness.

The structure of the Liturgy of the Word at Sunday Mass is: First Reading, Responsorial Psalm, Second Reading, Gospel Acclamation, Gospel, Homily, Profession of Faith (Creed), Prayer of the Faithful.

The first reading is taken from the Old Testament, except in Easter Time when it comes from Acts. The psalm is a scriptural response to the first reading.

The second reading comes from one of the New Testament epistles (letters).

The gospel reading is the high point of the Liturgy of the Word, so the assembly stands and acclaims Christ's presence by singing an acclamation.

The homily unfolds the mysteries of faith contained in the readings and relates it to our lives today. A short silence should follow the homily.

The pattern of the Liturgy of the Word is one of dialogue - between reader and listener, between God and us. We participate in this dialogue by listening carefully to the reader and preacher, by being attentive to what God is saying to us during the readings and the homily, and by joining in the assembly's responses.

If we don't have this referendum and enshrine the Voice in parliament it will be similar to previous attempts to wards Justice and equity and the dis-

solving of these steps by the first parliament that disagrees with the policy direction. Such as what happened to the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Commission.

I support the call of the Uluru Statement from the Heart and for a First Nations Voice enshrined in Parliament. This will help empower Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples to take their rightful place in their own country. Let us walk together with our First Nations people towards a better future for all Australians

In supporting the Yes vote May we echo the prayer of Jesus, our Brother in Christ, when he prayed, "May they all be One Father, as You and I are One".

THE REFERNDUM QUESTION: with all the confusion and fearmongering, what is the ACTUAL question we will be voting on? Here it is:

In recognition of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples as the First Peoples of Australia: There shall be a body to be called the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Voice.

If "YES" wins, the Constitution will change as follows: (My underlines—Denis)

The Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Voice <u>may</u> make representations to the Parliament and the Executive Government of the Commonwealth <u>on matters relating</u> to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples;

<u>The Parliament</u> shall, subject to this Constitution, have power to <u>make laws</u> with respect to <u>matters relating</u> to the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander <u>Voice</u>, including its composition, functions, powers and procedures.

That's it—no compulsion for Parliament to do what the Voice recommends and the Parliament itself will decide on its "composition, functions, powers and procedures".

If we don't like what the Parliament decides, we vote them out at the next election.—this is backed by the overwhelming legal opinion of our Constitutional lawyers.
