PREPARATION OF THE GIFTS

The Liturgy of the Word at Mass is followed by what is called the 'Preparation of the Gifts'. In the Preparation of the Gifts, the bread and wine for the Eucharist are brought forward, placed on the altar and a prayer said over them. The procession with the gifts by members of the assembly represents our participation in the eucharistic action as we offer ourselves along with the gifts of bread and wine.

The Missal's *General Instruction* mentions only bread, wine and money (or other gifts for the poor and the Church) in the procession. It is a procession of *gifts*: you can't take them back again afterwards!

In the early years of Christianity, the faithful brought bread and wine with them to church to be used in the celebration of the Eucharist. What wasn't used at the Mass was given to the poor and needy. Later, people started bringing other gifts of food or money which were offered for the work of the Church. In most parishes today a collection of money that will be used in the mission of the Church is taken up during the Preparation of Gifts.

Visitors to a Catholic Church are often surprised (and sometimes embarrassed!) when the collection plate comes around a second time at Mass. Having two collections is a way of separating donations for the support of the clergy from contributions to the cost of the parish services and operations.

THE EUCHARISTIC PRAYER:

Central to the Liturgy of the Eucharist at Mass is the Eucharistic Prayer. The priest offers this prayer on our behalf and we participate through the opening dialogue and the three acclamations, and by joining our personal praise and sacrifice to that of the Church.

The following elements are included in all **THIRTEEN Eucharistic Prayers** in the Missal, though the order varies:

Thanksgiving - especially in the Preface which gives thanks for the whole work of salvation or for some special aspect of it;

Acclamation - the "Holy, holy" sung by the people and presider after the Preface. Here we join the singing of the angels and saints before God's throne;

Invocation - or *epiclesis*, the calling down of the Holy Spirit on the gifts of bread and wine;

Institution narrative - the retelling of the scriptural account of Christ's words and actions at the Last Supper;

Memorial prayer - or *anamnesis* ('lest we forget') which recalls the paschal mystery;

Offering - the entire Church and this assembly offer Christ and themselves to God in union with Christ;

Second invocation of the Spirit - this time on those gathered that they may become "one body, one spirit in Christ";

Intercessions for the Church and the world, for the living and the dead;

Final doxology - ("through him, with him,"), the prayer of praise in which the celebrant sums up and concludes the thanksgiving offered to God.

THE REFERNDUM QUESTION: with all the confusion and fearmongering, what is the ACTUAL question we will be voting on? Here it is:

In recognition of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples as the First Peoples of Australia: There shall be a body to be called the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Voice. — If "YES" wins, the Constitution will change as follows: (My underlines—Denis)

The Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Voice <u>may</u> make representations to the Parliament and the Executive Government of the Commonwealth <u>on matters relating</u> to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples;

<u>The Parliament</u> shall, subject to this Constitution, have power to <u>make laws</u> with respect to <u>matters relating</u> to the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander <u>Voice</u>, including its composition, functions, powers and procedures.

That's it—no compulsion for Parliament to do what the Voice recommends and the Parliament itself will decide on its

"composition, functions, powers and procedures". If we don't like what the Parliament decides, we vote them out at the next election.— this is backed by the overwhelming legal opinion of our Constitutional lawyers.
