

ur Parish exists in our world and our economy. We are like a SMALL BUSINESS—our Gross Expenses for 2017 were \$268,504.83 (we pay wages, electricity and water costs, Insurance Premiums, the costs for Workplace Health and Safety and Safeguarding childrent and Vulnerable Adults, we pay for everything we use e.g. paper, fans, Audio visual supplies, maintenance of musical equipment, Bread, Wine, Internet, Maintenance of grounds, buildings, repair of the church seats (\$210 a time) etc, Coffee, Tea & biscuits for cuppas, resources for various training and ministries, a levy to cover Archdiocesan support (18% of collections) etc.) We do not seek to make a profit but need to at least cover costs. Over 70% of our INCOME is from what people put on the plate (physically or through Credit Card or Direct Debit.)

DID YOU KNOW that it **costs \$10.50** per week per per**son** (man, woman and child who worship) to cover the costs of our parish?

lanned Giving Program

The Archdiocese encourages Parishes to hold a Planned Giving Campaign each year to develop a culture of generosity and support for the parish. We endeavour to do so on one weekend of each year and are blessed and truly grateful for the support of parishioners over many years. Having a brief campaign at the same time each year allows parishioners to reconsider or renew their commitment and this will occur on the weekend of 8/9 September 2018.

Several parishes are giving consideration to transitioning from Printed Envelopes to Electronic Debit or Credit Card payment as the advantages are many. Less cash handling, the ongoing need for volunteers to give up their time to account for cash received, the rising cost of envelopes (now at \$8.00 per set), the loss incurred by purchasing envelopes which are not collected (20 sets following our last campaign) are just some of the issues.

At the present time there are 107 families giving by direct debit which is greatly appreciated. Payment by direct debit can be easily arranged as can changes to those arrangements once in place. More information will be provided during the next campaign. Please contact the Parish Office for further information and advice in setting up direct debit payments.

"It's wonderful to see the world co-operate in rescuing the 12 boys and their coach from the cave in Thailand. May the compassion continue. Australia needs to rescue the 127 refugee children trapped on Nauru. They need to be brought with their families to a safe haven now. Let's use the same creative and compassionate energy to ensure all those on Nauru and Manus are brought to a safe haven now. Let's stop the suffering. Let's stop the terrible damage to young lives." 
