ur Parish exists in our world and our economy. We are like a SMALL BUSINESS—our Gross Expenses for 2017 were \$268,504.83 (we pay wages, electricity and water costs, Insurance Premiums, the costs for Workplace Health and Safety and Safeguarding childrent and Vulnerable Adults, we pay for everything we use e.g. paper, fans, Audio visual supplies, maintenance of musical equipment, Bread, Wine, Internet, Maintenance of grounds, buildings, repair of the church seats (\$210 a time) etc, Coffee, Tea & biscuits for cuppas, resources for various training and ministries, a levy to cover Archdiocesan support (18% of collections) etc.) We do not seek to make a profit but need to at least cover costs. Over 70% of our INCOME is from what people put on the plate (physically or through Credit Card or Direct Debit.)

DID YOU KNOW that it **costs \$10.50 per week per person** (man, woman and child who worship) to cover the costs of our parish?

If yes, would you be prepared to tell us* about it? We are gathering stories to try and stop this exploitation and take action to help people who have suffered.


4) Have you or someone close to you had a bad experience with **vocational training**? A provider going broke, or providing inadequate training?


retreat day sponsored by the Knights of the Southern Cross, will be held on Saturday 4th
